With two months into the new year, I want to thank all the Posts who have been submitting their Community Service Reports (CSR) using the online system at www.vfwor.org. We are working hard to get all Posts trained to use this system for more accurate and timely record keeping. There is a PowerPoint put in the "Members Only" section for review and contact numbers if you need any additional information.

Once again, I remind you to please use the Online Membership System (OMS) that National has on their website (vfw.org). If you have not signed up yet, please do so. There is a PowerPoint on "Members Only" to help you if you have any questions.

As you know by now the VOD program is moving into the 21st century. National has partnered with Scholar's App (Scholars App) and now students can scan a QR code that will bring them to an online entry form where they can submit their entry via the internet. No longer will we need to play the game of "pass the thumb drive." The Department can provide some training on this system. An email has been sent to all district commanders with the learning video to pass onto their post commanders and VOD chairman for each post. This will take some time to learn, but we can do this. You can still (this year) turn in entries and judge them as in the past (paper forms) but remember some students may use the new QR code forms. Post chairs should contact their District chair for more information.

On a good note: The Mid-Winter Conference and Voice of Democracy Banquet will be in Portland again this year at the Embassy Suites near Portland Airport. We are finalizing the details and will publish them soon.

I came away from the 125th VFW National Convention in Louisville, KY, feeling positive about the direction the VFW is moving toward and I learned something about Parliamentary procedures as well. (Who would have thought!) Not to mention meeting and being with comrades from around the country and posts from overseas. I recommend that all VFW members, regardless of if you hold an office at your Post or are just a regular member, try to make one VFW National Convention in your lifetime.

I want to take the time for the rest of this article to mention and comment on resources all VFW Posts should have at their disposal, especially during a Post meeting:

The VFW PODIUM: BYLAWS, MOP AND RITUAL. The 2025 Podium edition will be published soon. Published annually following the VFW National Convention, the 2025 VFW Podium Edition contains the VFW's Congressional Charter, National Bylaws, Manual of Procedure and Ritual. This "must have" go-to reference book contains the organization's most up-to-date rules and regulations. From how to run a meeting, to guidelines for Posts, Districts and Departments, here you will find the answers to all your questions. Don't go to a meeting without it! Members may purchase a hard copy through the VFW Store for \$8 (available soon) or download the digital version for free.

To download a copy, go to www.vfw.org and log in, then go to My VFW/Bylaws: Training, Forms & Templates/2025 Podium: Bylaws, MOP & Ritual. The 2025 digital edition is available as of 8/29/24.

2. ROBERT'S RULES OF ORDER NEWLY REVISED (RONR) (Currently in the 12th Edition.)


The Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) follows Robert's Rules of Order as the governing rules for their meetings. These rules provide an orderly way to conduct business meetings, ensuring that discussions and decision-making proceed smoothly. By adhering to these guidelines, VFW members can focus on substantive matters rather than procedural details. If you have any specific questions about how the VFW applies these rules, feel free to ask! And an outstanding place to ask is on the Facebook group, "VFW Parliamentary Procedures and Bylaws Learning." It is administered by Joshua Schreck, the newly elected VFW Adjutant General, and he knows Parliamentary stuff!

3. ROBERT'S RULES OF ORDER, NEWLY REVISED, IN BRIEF I know I felt a little intimidated when I first cracked open Robert's Rules of Order. This short publication is recommended, it helps take the mystery out of it and know your way around RONR. I recommend that all Posts have a copy of this publication on hand. It can be purchased through amazon.com for a decent price.

I will now leave you with these two quotes from the man himself, Gen. Henry M. Roberts.

"Where there is no law, but every man does what is right in his own eyes, there is the least of real liberty." And "It is difficult to find another branch of knowledge where a small amount of study produces such great results in increased efficiency in a country where the people rule, as in parliamentary law."

Bonds:

National Bylaws require Posts, Districts and Departments to be bonded every year. Posts and Districts can purchase bonding through the Department of Oregon, or through a private insurance company. If you purchased your bond through Department and you have not submitted your application and payment, you're late as they were due by August 31st. Please get your application and payment in ASAP! If you bond with a private company, proof of that bonding needs to be provided to the Department of Oregon, so please send in a copy of your certificate. You may mail a hardcopy or email to qm@vfwor.org and admin@vfwor.org and we will make sure you are not on the hit list. QM bonds were due by 1 Sept 2024, club bonds (bartenders, bingo managers, etc.) are due by 1 Oct 2024. Both bond packets are available on the Department website www.vfwor.org.

Audits:

As a reminder, quarterly audits are due four times a year on August 1, November 1, February 1, and May 1. Thank you to everyone that turned their audit in on time or slightly late. If you are reading this and have not turned in Q4, you might get a reminder call or email as the list of those that have not submitted audits has been sent to the District Commanders. Well, what a great time that we had at National convention in Louisville, KY. Our department rocked this year, and I am very proud of all our members because each one of you helped us make it to the place that we attained this year. I can't wait to see where we end up this year. We made money for the department for the awards that we won for programs and membership. We need to keep this up in the continuing years. Its nice to hear our department name come up for the awards that we obtained.

They are starting to have training for Auxiliary and Department treasurers at National. We had a question-and-answer period for the Department treasurers, and we also made suggestions to National to make MALTA easier for treasurers to use. The bonds are all taken care of but if your Auxiliary didn't pay National, please send a check to me for \$30.00. Please make the check out to Department of OR VFWA and send it to me. If you wanted to increase your bond amount because you have more than \$20,000.00 in your account, then you can calculate out how much you need to add to the money that has been sent and write a check and place on the memo area of the check "Bond increase" and send to National. We make more points for the Circle of Excellence if we get the bonds all paid by the end of July and we need those points. So please if you have to vote on paying your bond, please get that accomplished at your June meeting and then you can pay it. It makes things much better if we have them paid before they are due.

The audit runs from April 1, 2024-June 30, 2024 this quarter. You have 30 days to get them into the department which would have been July 31, 2024. If your audit isn't completed yet and you haven't contacted the department to request an extension, you are overdue. If I don't have a copy of your audit in 2 weeks and you haven't contacted me, I will notify your Auxiliary President and the Department President and let her know that the audit is late. Almost half of the auxiliaries haven't sent me their audit. I am sure that some of you have completed it, but you haven't sent them to me so please look and make sure they have been mailed.







National POW/MIA Recognition Day

On National POW/MIA Recognition Day, we remind every American to never forget to honor those who were held captive and returned, and those who remain missing in action. is on September 20, 2024.



September 20 is a poignant reminder of those whose sacrifice helped pave the way to Freedom and protection of the American way of life. Established through proclamation signed by President Jimmy Carter in 1979, National POW/MIA Recognition Day is commemorated across the nation on the third Friday in September.

The plight of the more than 140,000 American former prisoners of war is a burden that stays with each of them, and we would be remiss if we do not acknowledge and honor those who endured such hardships on our behalf.

It is also the duty of every American to remember that some 81,000 service members are still listed as missing in action. Their families still hold out hope that one day they will receive the call that their loved one has been found. We owe them our support and vigilance until that day comes.

Whether you honor them by attending a POW/MIA ceremony, setting up a special POW/MIA table at an event, or holding a candlelight vigil, the more than 1.4 million members of the VFW and its Auxiliary ask to keep the candle of hope lit until all our nation's mission service men and women are accounted for.

In a recent edition of the VFW Action Corps weekly, the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency announced two identifications and four burial updates for service members who have been missing and accounted for from World War II and the Korean War. The National Home will be celebrating its 100th anniversary on June 28, 2025. Location: 3573 S. Waverly Rd., Eaton Rapids, Michigan 48827.

Founded in 1925 as a place for families who were left behind due to war, so they could remain together. The National Home is a 501 (c)(3) nonprofit organization (VFW and Auxiliary) as well as businesses and corporations that support veterans. The National Home assists military veterans and their families with children, by creating a foundation of services and resources to achieve their personal and family goals to move forward in a positive, safe, and healthy environment.

The National Home community is open to the families of actively serving military personnel, veterans and relatives of the VFW and VFW Auxiliary members. The family can be one or both parents with one or more children. The assistance available to them is at no cost and includes education, daycare, recreation and help with case management. There is no cost for lodging during their stay.

The community is a small town consisting of 42 single family homes on tree lined streets. It has a gym, library, computer and science labs, day care facilities, playgrounds, fishing pond, hiking trails and more. Homes are sponsored by States, military organizations, or private citizens. One of these buildings is a guest lodge annex. Oregon has one house that was built in 1957. It is a 1620 sq foot brick two story, 3 bed/1.5 bath house.

Michael Wilson is the Executive Director of The National Home. There are twelve elective members, one member appointed by the board, seven ex-officio members and twelve trustees. The twelve elected trustees represent one of the twelve National Home districts. They serve a six- year term. Oregon is in district number twelve, which covers California, Hawaii, Oregon, Washington, Alaska and the Pacific Areas. Our Trustee is Mary Anne Kreutz from California. She was just elected to the trustee position last year and will be there till 2029.

At our Post, Hutchinson-Rempelos Post 3182 in North Bend (Oregon), at each meeting after the National Home prayer we take up a donation. We collect anywhere from \$60.00 - \$120.00 per meeting. I am also planning to start a collection for the National Home at my recruiting table.

I hope to see you there for the tour of the complex and to celebrate the National Home's 100th birthday.
