mander must appoint a committee to oversee the care of the Post. While working with the Post, the committee found that there was a Department of Justice (DOJ) investigation into some of the Post accounts. Before that was settled, we were notified of an Internal Revenue Service (IRS) investigation. Each of these required a lot of work by the committee to avoid legal action being taken or the Post losing their nonprofit status. The hard working and dedicated members working on this are Chairman John Wrinkle and committee members Richard Halverson, Clifford Smith, Judith Burger and Dale Pack. They, along with State Quartermaster Cheryl Campos worked very hard trying to make sense of the Post records. Cheryl also dealt with providing the DOJ and IRS everything they needed to complete their investigations. That involved chasing a lot of records that were at best incomplete. For all their hard work I would like to say THANK YOU!

The second Post that I had to suspend was 4617 Beaverton. The committee working with that Post consisted of Chairman Bert Key and committee members Rick Higgins and Allen Anderson. They where able to facilitate a Post merger with Post 3452 Tualatin. While no one likes to lose a Post, sometimes it must be done. I would like to give a big THANK YOU to that committee for all their hard work as well.

It is important for me to let everyone know just how much I appreciate all of those who go that extra mile. As most know, Posts and Districts only have a few worker bees and the same is true for the Department. I think that we as members are often willing to let someone else take care of it. To all of those who step up at every level I would like to say thank you for your hard work, for if you don't keep up the hard work who will? We all can use some help and we need to try to encourage others to step up and be a part of the good works done by the VFW. If you are getting tired of being the one who does all the work, you need to train your replacement. I encourage you to find a member who can be inspired to help you. While they are learning, they can work alongside of you and make your job easier.

As I look at the recruiting report, I see that most of the Commanders, Quartermasters and Adjutants are short on the numbers needed to make All State. If you want to be All State or All American, I recommend that you watch the requirements. Remember, not only does the Post need to be 100% +, but the Officers also need to have some new or reinstated members. I know that new members are hard to come by, however most Posts have members who have dropped off the rolls that you might be able to convince to come back. I also hope that everyone is still calling their members to do welfare checks. We need to make sure that all the members are still doing okay, and we don't want to lose any more members just because no one checked on them. Let them know that we need to stand together to be strong. Some may need help with something but are too shy or don't know who to ask for help. As veterans we sometimes just don't want to ask for help; even when we need it.

If you are having trouble filling it out, call Richard and he will walk you through it. It is better to report something in the wrong place than not report at all, so if in doubt, report and let Richard move it if needed.


Once we can open and hold recruiting events, let us in Department know and we will be happy to help you.




Debra Anderson Quartermaster General Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States

Debra Anderson was elected Quartermaster General of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States on July 27, 2016, at the 117th VFW National Convention in Charlotte, N.C., making her the first female veteran to hold the position.

Prior to her election, she held appointed positions as Assistant Quartermaster General and Director of Human Resources and Investment Coordinator.

Anderson attended the University of Missouri-Columbia on an ROTC scholarship, where she majored in economics. In May 1980 upon graduation, she was commissioned in the Army as an AG (Human Resources) Second Lieutenant. Her mil-



itary assignments included Nuremberg/Furth, Germany; Fort Harrison, Ind.; Fort Riley, Kan.; Fort Leavenworth, Kan.; and Fort McPherson, Ga. She deployed as part of the division headquarters with the 1st Infantry Division during Desert Storm in December 1990.

During her 13 years of service, Anderson was awarded the Bronze Star, Meritorious Service Medal (2), Army Commendation Medal (4), Army Achievement Medal (2), National Defense Service Medal, Southwest Asia Service Medal, Army Service Medal, Overseas Service Ribbon, Kuwait Liberation Medal, and Parachutist Badge. Anderson earned a master's degree of science in systems management from the University of Southern California in 1989, and is a graduate of the Army's Combined Arms Services Staff School (CAS3) and Command and General Staff College (CGSC).

Anderson left the Army in 1993 and held a variety of management positions in business from 1993-2007. She joined VFW Post 7356 in Parkville, Mo., in 2006 where she maintains her Legacy Life membership, and has held the positions of Voice of Democracy Chair, Junior and Senior Vice Commander, All-American Post Commander, Trustee and District Adjutant. She is also a life member of the VFW Auxiliary and VFW National Home, where she also serves on the board. She currently serves as a Commissioner to the WWI Centennial Commission representing the VFW.

Debra and her husband Dr. Stephen Bourque, a 20-year Army veteran, live in Kansas City, Mo.


We are looking forward to doing this again in 2021.

Sherry Prudhon is on "limited access" due to her immune system. Her assistant is going to the facility almost weekly, but since they have had a COVID case there, things are very restricted. If you want to get bags to Sherry, she will get them to the residents.

We are coming up on the time for our "National Salute to Veterans" program, set for the week of February 14th. We need to get cards signed and ready to deliver to our VA's. Things might be loosened up by then so that we can have more access to our hospitalized Vets. Start getting cards signed at any group gathering you may have access to. Many small groups signing multiple cards will give you a number of cards to deliver to your VA. You

can also send them to the VA-VAS for that individual VA. They can then be given out to the hospitalized vets as allowed at that time.

I have also found that some nursing homes are welcoming gift bags for their residents. The activities directors are very willing to let you know the gender and branch of service for their residents and you can put together bags with a letter letting them know we have not forgotten them but are unable to physically contact them right now. Get them packaged cookies, cupcakes, and things like hand-made pillowcases, lap blankets, small flags, and items to relieve some of their stress. Try to give them something fun or cute to help breakup their feelings of abandonment that they may be suffering.




