Next year we have been asked to include 1 or 2 big cemeteries in McMinnville, St James and Evergreen.

Communicating Your Brand

I often hear people tell me that one way for the VFW to grow and attract new members is for National to pay for some slick advertising campaign on television. In some markets, running an advertisement is not expensive, so why isn't National doing it? It's because having an elaborate advertising campaign is not the easiest way to get the message out to the potential members.

The best way to showcase the VFW and your Post is for you and your Post to be out in the community. Get to know your community and let them know the local Veterans of Foreign Wars Post is there to help those in need. The return on investment for your Post will be greater than any television ad. Some ways to do this are:

Have people see you in the act of performing the good deed. If you are out mowing a veteran's lawn, or building a handicap ramp, wear your Post shirts and ball caps so that those passing by will take notice.

Showcase your Post's projects on the local community social media sites and community papers. To be most effective, be sure there are several mentions of what your Post is doing, not just a once-a-year mention. This is challenging with just working with a newspaper as the newspaper decides what goes in their paper and what is considered newsworthy. Teach Post members how to use Facebook and other social media so members are at ease talking about their accomplishments with the Post.

There is now an All-American requirement to have a Post Facebook page. This is a great way for people to see your Post out in the community. Since the requirement is to also link your Facebook page to the National Facebook Page, you are also showcasing what National is doing for veterans and what Posts around the country are doing. I know I am now connected to a lot more Oregon VFW Post Facebook pages and I have been impressed with all of the activities each of them are doing. With Facebook you can post everything your Post is doing and when you

MOVE! Coach allows veterans to monitor, track, and receive feedback on progress with exercise, diet, and weight loss goals.

Stay Quit Coach creates a tailored quit plan to stop smoking.

VetChange provides tools for cutting down or quitting drinking.

Why do we observe American Heart Month every February? Well, every year more than 600,000 Americans die from heart disease. The number one cause of deaths for most groups, heart disease affects all ages, genders, and ethnicities. Risk factors include high cholesterol, high blood pressure, smoking, diabetes, and excessive alcohol use.

Do you know how to keep your heart strong? You can take an active role in reducing your risk for heart disease by eating a healthy diet, engaging in physical activity, and managing your cholesterol and blood pressure. The new year is a great chance to start some heart-healthy habits! High blood pressure can hurt your health in many ways. The brain, heart, and kidneys can all be affected by the "Silent Killer" (which means it doesn't usually have any symptoms). Blood pressure can be measured at a doctor's office or at the local pharmacy. About one in two U.S. adults have high blood pressure and only about 25% of people have it under control. Comrades, Omicron variant is affecting our decisions. I received this information in December:

On behalf of the Commander-in-Chief, as a follow-up on our Monday December 20, 2021 announcement on the Voice of Democracy Parade of Winners going virtual in 2022, we are currently in a holding pattern for the 2022 Legislative Conference.

We are being told that there is a good possibility for an in-person Commander-in-Chief testimony. However, there will be restrictions that are very likely to include social distancing and mask wearing. Additionally, we are being told there will be a severe limit on the number of attendees in the room itself. What that number is has not yet been determined by Congress but numbers as few as 50 have been discussed.

Also, Senate and House Office buildings are closed to the public. Only individuals who have appointments with their representatives are allowed and everyone must be escorted by Congressional staff from the building entrance to the appointment and back to the entrance. This is very likely not going to change due to the increased concerns in the Washington DC Capitol region regarding the impact of the highly contagious Omicron variant.

Our plan is to see where we are the week of January 10th, at which time we will provide you further guidance. I will provide you with the latest news as it comes in.


