When I sat down at my computer this afternoon, I had an email stating that the articles for the Department Newspaper were due by the next day. So, I looked at my Colander to see what tomorrow held for me. The only thing written down on Friday, June 24, was my appointment to donate blood. I have been a regular blood donor since 1974 and have donated over five gallons of blood. So, why is that?

Well to begin with, for every pint of whole blood donated, it has the potential to save three lives. Out of that pint the Red Cross separates it into whole blood cells, plasma, and platelets. Hence, the potential to save three lives. If the receiver is an infant in the Neo-Natal unit of a hospital, the infant only needs a tablespoon of whole blood to survive. Yet, statistics indicate only five to six percent of the American population will take the opportunity to "Give the Gift of Life" one pint at a time.

Now, I promise I'm not having flash backs to my days as Department Surgeon. I will leave that to my friend Bert Little. But I believe that donating a pint of blood is one of the most important things a person can do to help saves lives. At this time most surgery centers have put all elective surgeries on hold due to the crisis of blood shortages. So, if you are like so many of us and need a new knee replacement or two, it may not happen in what you would consider a timely matter. Bummer, isn't it? All because people don't see the necessity of stopping by a donation site to help out.

I have heard all the excuses people make as to why they don't donate, and most of them aren't what I would really call a valid excuse. I heard it takes too much time, that a potential donor can't stand needles, and even say that at one time they contracted a rare and little-known tropical disease. Believe me; I get it. But for an investment of about fifteen minutes and a quick needle prick, you have helped to potentially save three people's lives. So please, go to www.redcrossblood.org, and find a donation site near you. The life you save just might end up being someone near and dear to you.

As Veterans we've all been called on to face the potential of shedding blood for our great Nation, and many of us did. I'm asking Veterans to once again take a half hour out of your day to shed another pint. The second-best part of donating is after the donation you get treats to eat and a choice of things to drink, and to reflect on the good thing you just did.



I want to thank the membership for allowing me to serve as your Surgeon this past year. For the 2022-23 year, I will be serving in the Judge Advocate role and would appreciate your support.

As your Judge Advocate, I encourage all officers and members to be familiar with our National Bylaws and Manual of Procedure. These are our guiding documents along with the Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised, 12th edition. It is important to invest in the tools needed to manage your post effectively. If you are on social media, there is a Facebook Public Group called "VFW Parliamentary Procedures and Learning". It is managed by our National Parliamentarian, Joshua Schreck. He posts many excellent resources and answers questions that are posted.

Make sure to order copies of the new Podium Edition at the VFW store for your officers (https://www.vfwstore.org/products/22690). This is the "bible" of our organization and contains the VFW Congressional Charter, Bylaws, Manual of Procedure and Ritual. It is spiral bound so that it lies flat when opened to any section and has easy to read large type. The cost is \$7.25 but it is well worth the money spent to have the information.

It is critical to develop a post calendar with deadlines and due dates. The Department is still missing Election Reports from 19 posts. Six posts have not been bonded. 17 posts have not submitted audits and 27 posts did not pay their delegate fees. Four posts have not submitted any paperwork this program year and are in jeopardy of being suspended. This is completely unacceptable! These items must to be submitted to Cheryl Campos, Department Quartermaster/Adjutant, on a timely basis.

The District and Department leadership is here to help make your VFW Post and Auxiliary successful. Please do not hesitate to reach out to me with any questions or concerns.



VFW AUXILIARY YEAR END PROGRAM REPORTS

Americanism: Chairman Debra Wright

46 Auxiliaries reported. 29 Auxiliaries conducted special programs on patriotic holidays; 6,179 American flags were presented (2" x 3" or larger.) 16 Auxiliaries participated in POW/MIA programs; 15 POW-MIA flags were presented (2" x 3" or larger.)

80 Certificates were presented to businesses or citizens in recognition of their displaying the U.S., POW/MIA flag or other displays of American pride.

12 Auxiliaries recognized Blue Star Mothers and families, Gold Star Mothers and families and/or Silver Star Mothers and families.

33 Auxiliaries conducted patriotic education in their community.

Auxiliary Community Outreach: Chairman Debby Fawver

25 Auxiliaries reported. 25 Auxiliaries implemented the Auxiliary Community Outreach program; 265 Auxiliary members participated in Auxiliary Community Outreach.

Auxiliary members volunteered 12,297.5 hours for programs or projects not affiliated with VFW or VFW Auxiliary programs.

9 Auxiliaries planned or participated in projects or programs to support and/or recognize first responders.

Buddy Poppy/National Home: Chairman Cathy Barber

36 Auxiliaries reported. 33 Auxiliary promoted the Buddy Poppy through distrivtu8ioln and education within the Post and/or Auxiliary; 31 Auxiliaries promoted the Buddy Poppy through distribution and education in the community.

42 Buddy Poppy drives were hosted with the Post; 54 Buddy Poppy drives were hosted without the Post (Auxiliary only.)

4 Auxiliaries participated in a Department Buddy Poppy Display contest.

27 Auxiliaries promoted the National Home within the Post and/or Auxiliary; 7 Auxiliaries promoted the National Home in the community

19 Auxiliaries promoted the National Home Helpline within the Auxiliary and/or Post; 4 Auxiliaries promoted the National Home Helpline in the community.

13 Auxiliaries purchased at least one National Home Life membership for an Auxiliary member; 15 National Home Life memberships were purchased for Auxiliary members.

Chief of Staff: Chairman Jessie Stober

35 Auxiliaries reported. 82 Auxiliaries presented "Good Job Awards" to Auxiliary members.

25 Auxiliaries were presented with a Certificate of Good Health.

The Department of Oregon developed talking points which the District Presidents used during Auxiliary official visits.

2 presentations were made to unaffiliated Posts about starting an Auxiliary; 1 new Auxiliary was instituted after a presentation was made to a Post.

Hospital: Chairman Becky Carroll

46 Auxiliaries reported. 3,132 members volunteered 4,590.75 hours in VA or non-VA medical facilities; 4 new adult volunteers were recruited.

38 Auxiliaries sponsored or conducted an event or activity in VA and/or non-VA facilities; 3 Auxiliaries participated in or educated VA and/or non-VA medical facilities about the Honors Escort Program. 3 Auxiliaries participated in National Salute to Veteran Patients Week.

10 Auxiliaries hosted a "Valentines for Veterans" party or event on-site at VA and/or non-VA medical facilities; 22 Auxiliaries delivered and/or sent valentines to veteran patients. 5 Auxiliaries hosted or participated in events for Women Veterans Health. \$37,531.24 was spent on all Hospital projects.

Legislative: Chairman Tracy Bogard

31 Auxiliaries participated in the program. 179 Auxiliary members subscribed to the VFW Action Corps Weekly.

676 personal contacts were made by Auxiliary members to legislators on veterans' issues; 753 emails were sent by Auxiliary members to legislators on veterans' issues; 185 letters or postcards were sent by Auxiliary members to legislators on veterans' issues; 142 phone calls were made by Auxiliary members to legislators on veterans' issues

225 Auxiliary members attended events where they could interact with legislators.

Membership: Chairman Jackie Key

45 Auxiliaries participated in the program. 23 Auxiliaries used phone calls to collect annual dues; 16 used emails; 34 used letters or postcards; 23 used face to face conversations; and 14 used social media.

25 Auxiliaries sent dues reminders utilizing reminders/notices generated in MALTA.

20 used media to promote Auxiliary membership in the community. 1 used radio, 12 used newspapers, 25 used social media and 7 used fliers.

18 Auxiliaries hosted training sessions on membership; 12 Districts hosted training sessions on membership; Department held 3 training sessions on membership.

Mentoring for Leadership: Chairman Debra Duggan

23 Auxiliaries participated in the program. 4 members were new mentors; 23 were returning mentors.

23 Auxiliaries used the "Mentoring at VFW Auxiliary-Relationship Building for the Future" materials; 23 Auxiliaries used resources available at vfwauxilitray.org/resources to start and/or continue mentoring in their Auxiliary.

Scholarship: Chairman Debbie "Cookie" Little

39 Auxiliaries participated in the program. 18 Auxiliaries promoted the Continuing Education Scholarship contest.

<u>Young American Creative Patriotic Art Contest</u>: 25 Auxiliaries promoted the Patriotic Art; 10 submitted an entry to a local Auxiliary; 5 entries were judged at the Department level; Auxiliaries presented a total of \$600 to students and the Department of Oregon presented a total of \$2,400 to students.

Patriot's Pen Essay Contest: 24 Auxiliaries and 90 members assisted their Posts with this contest.

Auxiliary members volunteered 278 hours.

Voice of Democracy Audio/Essay Contest: 22 Auxiliaries and 82 members assisted their Posts with this contest. Auxiliary members volunteered 256 hours.

11 Auxiliaries hosted or co-hosted an awards ceremony to recognize awardees and participants in any of these contests.

Veterans & Family Support: Chairman Dianne Guthrie

45 Auxiliaries participated in this program. 16 Auxiliaries hosted or co-hosted VFW Post fundraising activities for National Veterans Services; 10 Auxiliaries hosted or co-hosted VFW Post fundraising activities for VFW Veterans & Military Support program (MAP, Unmet Needs and "Sports Clips Help a Hero Scholarship.")

16 Auxiliaries participated in and/or sponsored events or projects for homeless veterans.

40 Auxiliaries provided direct aid to veterans, service members and/or their families; Donations of goods and services totaled a monetary value of \$89,598.12; \$6,844 in monetary donations was provided.

13,939 veterans/military personnel were assisted.

23 Auxiliaries promoted veteran and military suicide prevention and mental health awareness.

27 Auxiliaries provided support for veteran and military caregivers.

Youth Activities: Chairman Odette Force

45 Auxiliaries participated in the program. Auxiliaries worked with 4,992 youth and 44 youth groups across all programs.

40 youth were recognized with a Patriotic Youth award and 21 youth groups were recognized with a Youth Groups Supporting our Veterans citation.

4 Auxiliaries promoted and/or participated in Patriotism through Literacy.

Get Excited for the Red, White and Blue National Anthem singing contest: 22 Auxiliaries promoted the contest; 7 youth submitted an entry to a local Auxiliary and 4 were judged at the Department level. \$170 in awards was presented by Auxiliaries and \$200 was awarded by Department.

<u>Illustrating America contest</u>: 22 Auxiliaries promoted Illustrating America.
