





I have been asked in the past, "How has your Post raised the amount of funds that you have from your Buddy Poppy Distribution?" To help answer that question I gave a talk at the 103rd Convention of the Department of Oregon VFW on Friday, June 14th, during the afternoon VFW Programs session. It was well received, and I am sharing that presentation for this newsletter.

Since 2015 I have been at Three Rivers VFW Post 1324. During that time, we have raised funds each year ranging from \$30k to about \$55k. So, this presentation is just to share how Post 1324 has conducted its Buddy Poppy Distribution each year, which is done the 10 days prior to, and on Memorial Day.

Although most Posts emphasize Buddy Poppies on Veterans Day and Memorial Day, it is important to realize that the distribution of Buddy Poppies should be a year-round exercise. Each time a Post participates in an activity where the public will be present, Buddy Poppies should be present as a fundraising tool and simply to recognize our fallen comrades.

Where the VFW appears, Buddy Poppies should be there as a constant reminder that we will never forget those who have perished in the name of liberty. Just as "They Gave, Will You?" is a year-round thing, so should be the distribution of VFW Buddy Poppies.

I understand that each Post is unique in how it conducts its Poppy Distribution. I might be preaching to the choir, but I have confidence that what I present here can be helpful when conducting your own Poppy distribution. So, here goes:

Appoint a Poppy chairman to work with the Post Commander.

Get permission to set up stores, local merchants, etc., well in advance, about 2 months.

If you have multiple spots you plan to distribute from, develop and maintain a spreadsheet of dates, times, spots and members participating.

Order Poppies and supplies (through the VFW store) well in advance. A minimum of 3 weeks.

Partner up with another member, if possible. It helps with bathroom breaks, lunch, getting extra supplies, etc.

Have a "runner" to visit all spots if no partner.

What to wear:

VFW Cap (as a minimum.)

VFW White shirt.

Look neat and sharp.

Greet people that pass by. Be prepared to answer questions about the VFW "Buddy" Poppy and its significance and about the VFW.

Avoid controversial subjects.

Share your story as a veteran if asked.

Be friendly to all.

Have some snacks and water for yourself.

If another veteran organization, girl scout cookies, etc., is in your planned spot, DO NOT CONFRONT THEM OR GET INTO AN ARGUMENT. Contact your Poppy Chairman or Post Commander to resolve the issue. Even if it is another VFW Post.

Remember, "the eyes of the public are on you!"

Your Poppy Display

It can be as simple as poppies, a TV tray, and jar to collect funds to as elaborate as your imagination can get.

Have some kind of sign that promotes your Post.

Remember, the emphasis is on the VFW "Buddy" Poppy.

Bring a folding chair. (Stand up as much as you can, it attracts more attention than sitting down.)

Literature

The Story of the VFW "Buddy" Poppy.

Membership application. (This is also a recruiting opportunity for your Post.)

VFW recruiting pamphlets.

Voice of Democracy and Patriot's Pen essay pamphlets. Especially during Memorial Day, or any time prior to October 31st if you have a High School or Middle School close by.

After Actions

Letter or certificate of appreciation to the stores and merchants that participated. (See photo at right.)

An award of some kind to your top Post member fundraiser.

The Poppy Committee should meet as soon as possible after all the funds have been collected to determine where funds will be spent.

Members of this committee should be the Poppy Chairman, Post Commander, and the top earners.

Get Post approval as to where you plan to allocate the funds. Then distribute as soon as possible. The Post Commander, or his representative should present the check personally if possible. The Manual of Procedure provides that Post relief funds may be used for programs such as Voice of Democracy, Patriot's Pen, Citizenship Education, and Community Service as long as suggestions in the chairperson's guidebooks are used as an example of promoting these programs.

Posts are further reminded that Section 711 of the Manual of Procedure provides that non-profit organizations, exempt from taxes under Section 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code, may assist with the distribution of Buddy Poppies, provided there shall be no division of proceeds. A donation to these groups may be made from the Post general fund.

Like any fundraising, the more time and participation involved by your Post members, the more funds you will collect. It is as simple as that.

Let me end this article by saying I am proud to be elected as the next Judge Advocate for the 2024-2025 year, I will do my best in that position as I am able.

Membership is a keynote program of the VFW Auxiliary; we need members to work on the other programs and get other people involved in the organization to keep it healthy. We were very fortunate this year as we didn't lose any Auxiliaries and didn't lose that many members. We recruited two-thirds of the members that we lost from cleaning out the At Large list last year, we only have about fifty to get back to where we started the year before. Deb calls her area of the state "the Wild Side," so let's get WILD and get 100%+ by December 31, 2024. It would be so great for the Department to have 100%+ when we go to our Mid-Winter Conference in February 2025.

We have four recruitment totes spaced all over the state. By the time that we have all our Academies done this year we will have them restocked with the things that we need to get new members and we will build up a few more so that we can have a few more. Any place that has a festival, rodeo, fair or anything that you can set up a recruiting booth, please get them set up. If you need someone from the Auxiliary to help you, contact Deb Duggan or I and we will get a crew to your area. We will love to help you get more members. We will be giving awards to the Auxiliary that has the most recruiting events during the year, so at your next meeting discuss some times that you can hold recruiting tables.

Recruiting is only a small part of what the membership likes to do for the members. We would also like to retain our members. If you get a new member to your Auxiliary and you do not invite them to help with activities that your Auxiliary is doing, they will get bored and stop coming to the meetings. I have a list of 7 or 8 members that I call before every meeting and social to remind them that we have something happening in our Auxiliary. If you decide to have a baked food sale or any other money-making activity, invite your new members to be part of the group. Have them help call members to check on them and if they have not paid their dues have them check to see if they would like to pay their dues.

Each Auxiliary and Department needs to have a Membership Plan. In this plan you should have ways of contacting your members, try to talk to former members and find out why they stopped being members, the other important thing in your plan is when to have recruiting tables. Just remember when you get new members make them welcome in your Auxiliary or you will lose them.

Remember there is a change in the dues for most of the levels of the Auxiliary. Starting on July 1st, \$10.00 out of the money that you get from your members will be going to National. If you voted last year to increase your dues, make sure your increase is in MALTA so that your dues letter will have the amount that National, and your Auxiliary is taking out. If your Auxiliary has not yet voted on increasing your dues, you need to notify all your members and then have a meeting to vote on increasing your dues. Department dues until January 1, 2025, will still be \$5.00 but then will increase to \$8.00, so please try to get all your dues paid before the end of the year.

Dues Angels

We will continue with the Dues Angels for the next year. It is a great program, and members love the chance to make some money for paying for members that cannot pay their dues. For each member that you pay the dues for, we will place a piece of paper in the drawing, and you have a chance to get a prize from the Department. At Mid-Winter and Department Convention we will select two Dues Angels and they will win \$25.00 for helping our members.

Awards for Auxiliaries & Districts

We will be giving to each member that gets 1-6 new members this year one of Deb's membership pins. Over six new members, you will receive her charm for your charm bracelet. We have yet to decide what we will do for the member that gets the most number of members for the year, but we are working on it so keep reading our articles.

The first Auxiliary that makes it to 100%+ by August 31, 2024, will receive \$50.00 from the department.

The first district that makes it to 100%+ by September 30, 2024, will receive \$50.00 from the department.

We will be issuing 100% bracelets again this year. So, at academies, district meetings and Mid-Winter we will be issuing bracelets. They are for your President and the Membership chairman or Treasurer.

National awards for Auxiliaries in the Department

Each Auxiliary that reaches 100%+ in members by June 30, 2025, will receive \$50.00 from National.

Each Auxiliary that reaches 101% Plus by June 30, 2025, will be entered in a one-time drawing to receive \$500.00 from National.

At Large Members

At this time, we have 846 members that are at large. We need to get more of these members into our Auxiliaries to help with the programs and help this Department shine. Our goal in the next year is to have a contest for the Auxiliaries. This money is not coming from the Department, it is coming from some of the Line Officers and what we are going to do is have two contests. From July 1, 2024, until Mid-Winter conference the Auxiliary that has the most transfers from at large into their Auxiliary will receive \$50.00. We will do the same contest from Mid-Winter to Department Convention and give out another \$50.00. We need to get these members into Auxiliaries, not only for the department but for those members. There are some that were not notified that their Auxiliary closed and did not know that they were at large until they got their new card. I will bring copies of the At Large lists to the Academies so that you can take pictures of them, and I will have several copies by towns. And remember the At Large dues are going up starting January 1, 2025. Please let them know when you speak to them or write your letters to them. The cost will go from \$40.00 to \$50.00 and \$15.00 of that will go to National for those members.

I will be having some Zoom meetings in the coming year on Membership and ways of retaining your members and ways to get more members to help our veterans. I will be sending out emails to your Auxiliaries and if you are interested, please email me and I will be glad to send you a link to the training. We are going to have a successful year this year and make the "Wild Side" proud.

One more thing, I just found out that my Ambassador does not require an end of the year report so that means that you need to send me monthly reports of what you do for Membership. Remember how many recruiting events you have and all other aspects of the program, please share monthly with what you are doing. I will build a spreadsheet to keep up with your progress. I am really excited about keeping track this way, so please don't forget me when you do anything for membership.


