VFW to Host Virtual 2021 Parade of Winners

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (March 4, 2021) – The Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) will host its first-ever virtual Parade of Winners <u>live on Facebook</u> April 1, 2021, at 7 p.m. CDT. The event will recognize all state winners of the VFW's Voice of Democracy scholarship competition as well as the national Patriot's Pen contest winner, and will include special guest appearances by those known to the VFW community. The <u>virtual Parade of Winners</u>, sponsored by <u>Twisted X</u> and <u>Dell</u>, will culminate with the surprise announcement and onsite presentation of the first place \$30,000 T.C. Selman Memorial Scholarship award at the winner's home.

"The disappointment of not being able to award all of this year's scholarships in person doesn't diminish the impact that the \$3 million in total scholarships and awards presented at the national, state and local levels of our youth scholarship

competitions will have on our youth as they look to college and their futures," said VFW National Commander Hal Roesch II. "Our students have overcome so much in the past year, and this year's submissions left me filled with the hope and confidence that our nation has a bright and influential future with these young people taking the lead."

The Covid-19 pandemic has impacted the Legislative advocacy for the VFW's annual visits to Capitol Hill. The September Legislative Conference was done by Zoom or Phone conferences and was highly successful. We have just completed the March Legislative Conference, the same as September's and again was highly successful.

All the meetings with Oregon's Congressmen/ Congresswoman, Senators and their staff were well received. We covered the VFW Talking Points that were supplied by the VFW National Legislative office in Washington DC. Oregon's Representatives in Washington had many questions about the issues that the VFW brought forward. Each one thanked us for our advocacy for Veterans and appreciated our efforts.

Some of the topics discussed included Toxic Exposure, extend the deadline for Gulf War Veterans Toxic Exposure Act, pass S.B. 89, Ensuring Survivor Benefits During COVID-19 Act of 2021, pass the Veterans Economic Recovery Act, establish a fourth administration in the VA (for economic opportunity benefits), disabled veterans to receive an automobile grant every ten years instead of a one-time grant, pass H.R. 239 Equal Access to Contraception for Veterans Act, pass the Richard Star Act and for the DOD to develop a Base Housing comparison Tool.
