POSTS AND AUXILIARIES IN ACTION



#Still Serving - Florence Post 3232Connections, Community, Camaraderie

There is no question that the VFW has a long-standing commitment to end not only veteran suicides, but suicides from within all sectors of our communities. So, after Donna-Marie Drucker, Executive Director of the Oregon Firearms Safety Coalition, delivered her presentation on Firearm Safety and Suicide Prevention at the Department of Oregon's Mid-Winter conference, it was clear that this was a message that needed to be repeated. Her presentation highlighted some disturbing statistical and demographic data about suicides in Oregon; data that fit the community of Florence all too well.

Florence Post 3232 was searching for ideas to kick-off this year's "#Still Serving" campaign on May 6th. Ideas that had the potential to bind both the veteran and civilian service communities, and there it was. Suicide Prevention.

Post 3232 Commander, Bruce Andrade, immediately opened a dialogue with one of the Post's most valued community partners, Elks Lodge #1858, to talk about hosting a suicide prevention seminar in Florence. After contacting Donna-Marie Drucker to check her availability and invite her to be the keynote speaker, the date was set; May 6th would be the day for a Suicide Prevention Seminar in Florence and the kick-off of Post 3232's #Still Serving initiatives for 2023.

Commander Andrade reached out to Will Wagner, M.A., LPC, and Readjustment Counseling Therapist, of the Eugene Vet Center, and to Cal Applebee, a retired business professional and community volunteer, to help develop and promote this event.

Cal Applebee secured spots on KCST Radio's "Our Town" segment where we recorded a 10-minute interview promoting the May 6th seminar that was broadcast to Florence residents throughout the month of April. Applebee also was able to get Public Service Announcements to air on KXCR radio in Florence, and an article in the Siuslaw News, which ran on three occasions during the month of April.

Will Wagner rallied his professional contacts from Roseburg, Eugene, Florence, and other surrounding communities to assemble a Resource Panel of 10 public and veteran service agencies to be on-hand to, not only answer questions that would arise from the days' presentations, but to bring awareness to the community services they offered.

This proved to be an excellent opportunity for these agencies to network and build relationships that would set the stage for future presentations up and down the coast and throughout the state of Oregon. Interest is already building to present this same seminar in the Coos Bay area and in other communities along the coast.

One of the benefits of these connections provided an excellent upgrade to our May 6th Program. Stacy Nielsen, LCSW, VA Suicide Prevention Coordinator, was added to the agenda to present the VA's suicide prevention program, SAVE (Signs, Ask, Validate, Encourage). This was a spot-on presentation in support of crisis intervention as a proven method of preventing suicides.

The highlight of the May 6th seminar was Donna-Marie Drucker's presentations on QPR (Question, Persuade, Refer), a program that focuses on crisis intervention as a front-line method to dissuade suicide attempts, and on Firearm Safety, which focuses on best practices for preventing unintentional access to firearms, especially during a time of crisis. As we learned, Firearms are the most lethal of all methods of suicide attempts. Donna-Marie's presentations drew a rousing round of applause from both the audience and the service professionals in attendance.

While the emphasis of the programs that Donna-Marie Drucker and Stacy Nielsen presented was on suicide prevention through crisis intervention, the Resource Panel offered advice on an emerging group social issues impacting veterans and other less-fortunate members of our communities, such as homelessness, transportation, housing, mental health, emergency crisis response, and perhaps, as equally important, the benefits of establishing community connections to these resources. The panel featured representatives from Lane County Suicide Prevention, the Eugene Vet Center, Helping Hands Coalition, Roseburg/Eugene VA Suicide Prevention & Clinical Pharmacy, West Lane Mobile Crisis Response, Florence Police Department, Siuslaw Outreach Services, Options Counseling Florence, Easter Seals, Florence Watch and American Legion. Florence Post 3232 was also represented and able to recruit a new member for the post.

There is little question that Suicide Prevention is a complex and multifaceted issue that can seem daunting and overwhelming to the average person. After hearing the presentations from Donna-Marie Drucker and Stacy Nielsen, and the comments from the Resource Panel, the message is clear. You don't need to be an expert to make a difference in someone's life.

Over 80 people attended the seminar. Guests were not only from Florence, but from places as far away as Corvallis, Coos Bay, Eugene, Albany, Salem, Seal Rock, and even Curry County. Everyone, who attended, enjoyed an outstanding lunch, compliments of Elks Lodge #1858, and they walked away with a "Goodie Bag" that included detailed contact information for most of the veteran and social agency resources available in Lane County and the VA system.

As is typical of Post 3232's membership, members of the Post and its' Auxiliary were available throughout the entire process of producing and executing this seminar to make it a huge success. During this process, the camaraderie between VFW, its community partners, the VA, and other veteran agencies was undeniable.

Greetings Comrades and Auxiliary,

It has been a busy month. Cheryl and I went to Harrisburg and picked up the Post's paperwork since they were shut down and had their charter pulled. From Harrisburg we went to Myrtle Creek and picked up their books and records as they also had their charter pulled by National. From there we traveled to Rogue River to assess the water damage done to the building due to a broken water line in the Men's bathroom. It was bad and all the floor tiles had to be removed. This has been done and we hope to get the building sold soon.

Cheryl and I spent the 20th through the 23rd of April at VFW National headquarters for training. We still have a lot left to do before this year is over.

Our membership is way down with only 12 posts at 100 percent. We are still in last place nationally for membership! We are only at 87.31 percent collectively. Oregon is better than this! There is no reason for this except Post Commanders are not doing their jobs! If it does not change by the end of May, we will have some Post leadership changes!

We need 400 members renewed to be at 90 percent. We have 15 posts at 90 percent, and I need to see those at 100 percent by the end of May. There are also 12 posts that are at 85 percent or above. These posts need to keep working their unpaid members because I know a lot of them are expired.

Oregon needs more members so we can accomplish more for our veterans and their families. Remember to ask others if their grandparents, parents, brothers, sisters, or children served or are serving in a war or conflict overseas. Remember to look at the DD214.

Proof of eligibility furnished must be:

- Separation document or
- DD214 reflecting campaign medal service to establish eligibility.
- Service in Korea without the issuance of a campaign medal can be established with additional support documentation.
- Hostile Fire or Imminent Danger Pay can be established with pay records.
- Other documents acceptable by VFW are also acceptable for Auxiliary eligibility.

Get familiar with the Bylaws and look on pages 5-11. Please remember to use the most recent application which has a date in the bottom right-hand corner of May 22.

Check out Bylaws Sec. 102, Sec. 103 and Sec. 104.

Check out the resources page on MALTA under membership. There is plenty of information for all to use.

lain to the Oregon State Commander.


Dennis will be most remembered for his sense of humor, his love of adventure and American history and most especially his love of service to the veteran community.


