Department and National use these reports to ensure each post can maintain their non-profit status. **(Thank you).**

If you or your post are still having a problem using this system, please call or email me and I will be glad to help you enter the information.

I want to personally thank all the District Commanders in submitting your VOD entry forms, you responded to all my emails and phone calls when I had a question on one of your entries. This made it a smooth process for the department chairperson.

I am pleased to say our department did very well this year on the VOD program. We had a student from every district. Thank all you district commanders and VOD chairman for your hard work. I know at times it was hard for you to get all your information into me on time, but we did it with many emails and phone calls.

The district VOD chairman (some were new this year) responded very promptly when I emailed for more information or updates.

There were 14 posts who submitted students one district had two posts send in entries.

Total money reported from the entry forms are as follows.

Posts = \$9,350.00 Additional = \$2,270.00
District = \$1,006.00 Grand total = \$12,626

Now these are just the totals that were sent in on the entry forms. There may have been more money spent that was not noted on the submitted forms.

I know the posts and districts were really trying hard this year because of all the calls I received asking questions on what I needed for the reports. At Three Rivers VFW Post 1324's April "First Friday Veteran's Breakfast" they had as guest speaker Mark Newall, from Oregon Department of Veterans Affairs, Mark is the Veteran Volunteer Coordinator and Aging Veteran Services specialist. One of the topics he spoke about was ODVA's 2022 Oregon Veterans Benefit Magazine, which is available online and in print. The 2022 edition is the most current version of the magazine, ODVA is working on a new edition but no date so far as to its publication.

I knew of this publication, after downloading and going through it I highly recommend that all VFW members either download a copy or request a printed version through www.oregon.gov/odva, or call (503)373-2390. It is very comprehensive in its coverage of veteran benefits offered by ODVA.

Here is a short description of what the magazine covers:

Veteran Service Officers Directory: Here you will find a list of Service Officers for the ODVA, Tribal Veteran SVO's, National Veteran Service Organizations (VFW, DAV, American Legion, etc.), and Oregon County SVOs.

How to File a Disability Claim. It has steps to lead you through the process.

Disability Compensation & Pension. Service-Connected Disability Compensation and Veterans' Improved Pension are monetary benefits paid by the federal VA to veterans under certain conditions. A Veteran Service Officer in your area can help you determine if you qualify for one of these benefits.

Health Care. For most veterans, entry into the federal VA health care system begins by applying for enrollment. If you are not enrolled, you can apply at any time. If you served in the U.S. Armed Forces, you could use the federal VA Health Benefits Explorer to learn about the benefits you could receive if you are enrolled with federal VA for your health care. To apply or use the federal VA Health Benefit Explorer, visit www.va.gov/healthbenefits.

VA Health Care Directory. Here you will find Federal VA Medical Centers in the state and Outpatient Clinics.

Veteran Crisis Line and Signs of Crisis and Behavioral Health Directory. Veterans, service members and their loved ones can contact the Veterans Crisis Line to receive free, confidential support 24 hours a day even if they are not registered with the federal VA or enrolled in VA health care. Call 988 and press 1, send a text message to 838255, or start a confidential online chat session at www.VeteransCrisisLine.net/chat.

Education. Higher Learning options after active service ends. Many veterans turn to higher education to further their skills and training after serving their country.

Oregon Veterans Homes. Care at an Oregon Veterans' Home is an earned benefit available to honorably discharged veterans, their spouses, and parents of a service member who died while serving in the U.S. Armed Forces.

Long Term Care. Numerous resources are available to help veterans, as well as their families and caregivers, with the challenges of growing older or living with a serious disability, including nursing and home care, respite care and financial services

Housing and Home Loans. Whether you are looking to purchase your first home or adapt an existing residence to fit your service-connected needs, ODVA and its partners want to help you achieve your dreams of home ownership and independent living.

Family Benefits. Veterans' families also make great sacrifices in service to their country. ODVA magazine offers information about benefits and programs that may be available to you as a veteran's spouse, dependent or survivor.

Burial Benefits. Every veteran who honorably serves their country has earned the right to be laid to rest with honor and dignity — among their brothers and sisters in arms, if they wish. There are several benefits available to help guide veterans in deciding their wishes for a final resting place.

Business. If you are a veteran interested in starting or growing your own business, you are not alone! The state of Oregon and many of its partners are on your side and want to help you secure a financial future for you and your family.

Employment. Veterans bring valuable skills and experience from their military service to the workforce. Resources are available to help veterans get the most out of their careers — whether seeking advancement at a current position or looking for the right fit for a first civilian job.

Transportation. This is support for rural and disabled vets. The federal VA has the authority to provide eligible beneficiaries reimbursement for mileage, special mode of transportation, and in certain circumstances, a taxi or hired car.

License Plates, Records & ID's. The state offers several ways to support the public display of your veteran status. There are also times when you may need proof of service, such as for health care or consumer discounts.

Justice Involved. Help for justice-involved veterans. ODVA works with the veterans in the state prison system to verify veteran status, advocate for veterans benefits and assist veteran families with federal VA benefits that may be transferable to them.

Homelessness. For those veterans that are homeless and unsure of the veteran specific resources available to them, they can call toll free 877-4AID-VET (877-424-3838). Homelessness among veterans in the U.S. has declined by almost 50 percent in the last decade, according to VA statistics.

Recreation. Veterans have access to unique opportunities for hunting, fishing, hiking and other outdoor recreation at state and national parks and on other public lands. Always check for a veteran discount on park passes or sporting licenses.

DID YOU KNOW? Veterans with a service-connected disability may camp for free at Oregon state parks with a special access pass.

As you can see, there is a wealth of information for veterans in the ODVA magazine. Many questions that veterans ask are covered here, this is a great resource for all VFW Posts.

Department Secretary May Article

This has been an interesting year serving as your Department Secretary. I have learned a lot! One of the things I have learned that I want to remind Secretaries at all levels of is that MALTA should be your first stop when you are looking for forms, such as Installation reports or Delegate forms. As a Secretary, when you log in to MALTA you see a tab called "Duties." To see what kind of forms and other information are available to you, scroll down and review everything on that page. You will see near the bottom of the page that you can click on something called "Officer Resources." In there you will find many of the forms you need to do your job, such as the Installation form. I have had to send this form to many of you, which I do not mind doing, but in the future, you can save time for yourself by using this resource. Do not be afraid to explore everything available to you on MALTA. It is a wonderful tool!

I have also had Secretaries ask me where to find the Warrant for elections. That is a form that is no longer in use. All you need is the Installation form.

I am still waiting for some of you to send me a copy of the Installation form. I need this form for Department records, but also so I can complete the Department Roster for next year. I want to be as accurate as possible, and I need your Installation form (the long form please,) to make that happen.

You can input your newly elected officers in MALTA yourself by going to your Duties tab and clicking on "Officers/Installations." There you will see your current officers. At the upper right corner, there is a blue box with the words "Enter Installation Report." This is where you enter your new officers. You can choose "Save & Close" as you go along. When you are finished entering all the new officers and they have been installed, click on "Save & Continue." The system will walk you through the rest. Just remember, you still need to send me a copy of the signed Installation form. If you have problems navigating MALTA, be sure to let me know so I can do input the installation information for you.

I also need your Department Delegate forms. Delegates must be elected at least 30 days before the Department Convention, which starts on June 13. Send a copy of the form and a check payable to the Dept of Oregon VFWA to Department Treasurer Sonya Sallee for your delegate fees. You can email a copy to me or send it by snail mail. If you want your Auxiliary to be able to vote at the Convention, I must have those forms and Sonya must have your check. You need one delegate and one alternate for every 15 members (or fraction thereof) you have at the time of election. I send the forms out to all Presidents and Secretaries, but if you need another copy let me know.

Delegates for National Convention are done through MALTA. This is also found under the "Duties" tab. For National, you need one delegate and one alternate for every 50 members (or fraction thereof) at the time of election. There is no fee for National delegates. Keep in mind that if your Auxiliary does not register any delegates for National, your Auxiliary will not have a vote at the Convention.

I have emailed forms to your Presidents and Secretaries to make sure everyone had them. I have also responded as quickly as possible to anyone who asked for copies, even though they were already provided. I would rather send out multiple copies than have an Auxiliary or District Secretary not be able to do their job.

If any of you need help with anything, please call or email me. Do not be afraid to ask questions. Part of my job as Department Secretary is to help you be successful. My phone number is 541-678-3894 and my email is vjwrinkle@gmail.com. Let's finish this year on a high note!

Here is hope spring will eventually arrive and that I get to see you at our Department Convention next month!
