VETERANS SERVING OTHERS: MEMBERS OF THE GREATER YAMHILL VFW POST 4015 & MEALS ON WHEELS AT THE CHEHALEM SENIOR CENTER.

“Meals on Wheels” uses the Chehalem Senior Center in Newberg to prepare food for seniors Monday through Friday each week. On Fridays the clients also receive two frozen meals to cover the weekend. The 1st Friday & 3rd Thursday of each month are VFW days. On those days VFW members help plate up the food and some veterans who are good at driving in foul weather also volunteer to deliver when the weather is bad.

This is such a great program. They even have special meals for clients who are vegan, vegetarian or diabetic. The seniors receive menus that they can pick their meals from. for Meals on Wheels.. The VFW comes in and helps plate up all the food for the “Meals on Wheels” drivers.

On this day the choices were Chicken breast w/ gravy or sliced ham w/raisin glaze, mashed sweet potatoes, green peas w/ pearl onions, slice of bread, milk, and cherry cobbler. Everything smelled great!

WILDLIFE ADVOCACY FOR VETERANS IN NEED, ROSEBURG, OREGON

“Wildlife Advocacy for Veterans in Need” was started in Roseburg, Oregon with VFW Post 2468 in May of 2008 with the idea of helping both the local farmers and Veterans in need. Our program started with one farmer that had a plum tree grove that was impacted by deer damaging his trees. He asked if I could help. The Department of Fish and Wildlife issued 9 salvage tags and we started work on removing the deer and processing the animals to get the meat to needy Vets. We try to hand out 2 weeks’ worth of meat to each Veteran.

The Department of Fish and Wildlife let us know we could not make any money off the meat, we either had to donate the meat or toss it in the dump. With those being our only two choices, we decided to donate the meat. Food pantries can only take in USDA inspected meat and this source of meat is NOT USDA inspected, but we can donate to veterans!

One Veteran and his family of 5 stands out in my mind. All the long night hunts, hours of processing meat, the time it takes, and the money spent cannot compare to one phone call at 7:00 at night from a 4-year-old girl before she would go to bed saying, “Thank you for the meat, it was yummy!” It made it all worthwhile.

Within two years of starting this program the Oregon State Police contacted me asking if we would take Game animals that they confiscate as illegally killed animals (this IS NOT road kills.) We were more than happy to help them with getting this meat to people’s tables.

We now have other sources of meat we are able to process. We have received beef, pork, and lambs from 4-H and FFA members who have project animals they want to donate for needy Veterans and needy Families. Within the last year alone we have received 2 beef cattle that have been donated bringing the total beef donated to 5 from different farms since we began this program.



The first two beef cows came to us from a rancher in Lake County over 400 miles away from Roseburg. The ranch owner heard about this program from his daughter who received meat from us when she was in need and let her mom know about us.

As of January 1, 2022, the “Wildlife Advocacy for Veterans in Need” program has fed 7815 people since it began. 90% of those are Veterans or Veteran’s families. The other 10% are people in the community that are in need. We are also able to donate to other nonprofit groups to help them support the community.

Our only income is from donations, and with the support of others we are building an asset to our community.

My Fellow Comrades,

Our program year is winding down and we are preparing for the June Convention to be held in North Bend from June 8-12, 2022. We will gather to celebrate our success over the past year. I hope that all Department of Oregon members are healthy and well.

According to the American Diabetes Association (ADA), one in three American adults is at risk for developing Type 2 diabetes. There are many factors that increase this risk. Some you can control while others such as aging or having parents or siblings that have diabetes you cannot control. Whichever the case, it is good to know what they are and what you may do to help prevent the condition in the first place.

Thankfully, a healthy diet and lifestyle can go a long way in reversing some of these factors. Two factors that you cannot control have already been mentioned but knowing your risks may help you kick-start healthy habits to protect you from developing diabetes and other diseases. It is important to alert your doctor to the fact that you may be subject to the disease due to family members having it. So, what are a few of the conditions you may control?

You are overweight – It is a major factor in developing the condition as well as increasing your chances of having high cholesterol, high blood pressure, heart disease, etc. According to the experts, losing 10 to 15 pounds can make an enormous difference.

You are not exercising – This is something we can all do, especially now. Exercise is important for many reasons, but one major factor is the protective benefits when it comes to preventing chronic diseases. It is recommended to stay physically active most days of the week aiming for at least 30 minutes a day. Check with your doctor before beginning a new exercise program to make sure it is right for you.

You have high blood pressure – It is estimated that close to half of all American adults have high blood pressure, or take medication for high blood pressure, which puts you at a higher risk for developing Type 2 diabetes or other conditions. Improving your diet and lifestyle can help lower your blood pressure.

You have low levels of “good” HDL cholesterol – When you look at HDL or “good” cholesterol, the higher is better! Studies have shown that having low HDL cholesterol increases your risk of Type 2 diabetes. Eating a healthy diet with a focus on foods higher in fiber and heart healthy fats, as well as increasing activity and losing weight can all help improve HDL levels.

You enjoy alcohol a little too much – This can cause inflammation in the pancreas and limit its ability to produce adequate insulin for your body. The ADA recommends that people who drink alcohol do so in moderation, which is defined as no more than two drinks per day for men, and one drink for women.

I am an experienced Technology Project Manager with more than 20 years' experience. I have a BS Degree in Technology Management and an AS degree in Military Science. I earned my VFW eligibility during mobilization and deployment to Iraq (OIF) 2005-2007. I was commissioned in the US Army Reserve (Field Artillery) in 1979. I have served on Active Duty, US Florida Army National Guard and US Army Reserves (USAR and Individual Ready Reserve)

Currently, I am still serving our Oregon Veterans as Post Commander for Gresham United Post 180, Former Commander for Oregon District 15, and State Service Officer. I am also a Toastmaster and have earned the Competent Toastmaster (CTM) and Competent Leader awards. I am also a member of Disabled American Veterans (DAV) Chapter 1 (Portland) and am a former Sr. Vice Commander.

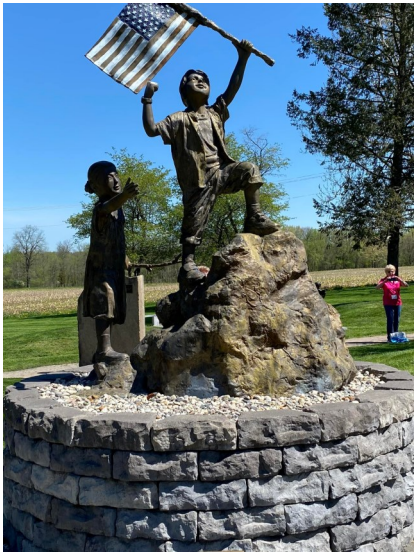
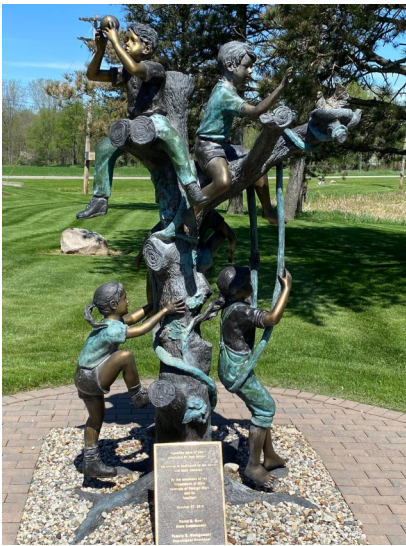
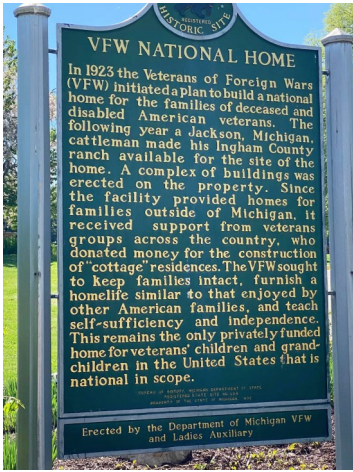

Participating in all the Schools of Instruction and the Midwinter Program Promotion provided me with an opportunity to get to know people from all over the State.

Oregon is 100% reported! All 45 Auxiliaries reported, including Klamath Falls, our newest Auxiliary. Once all the numbers were entered I found it important to re-read many reports.

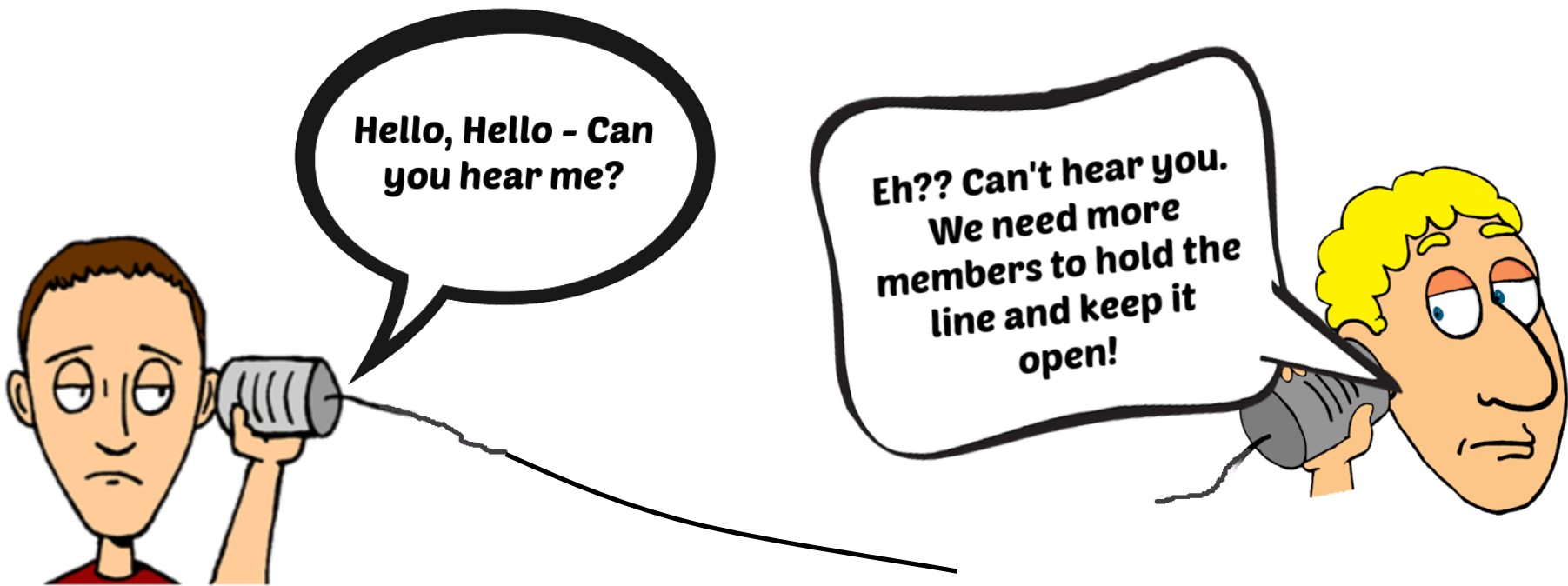

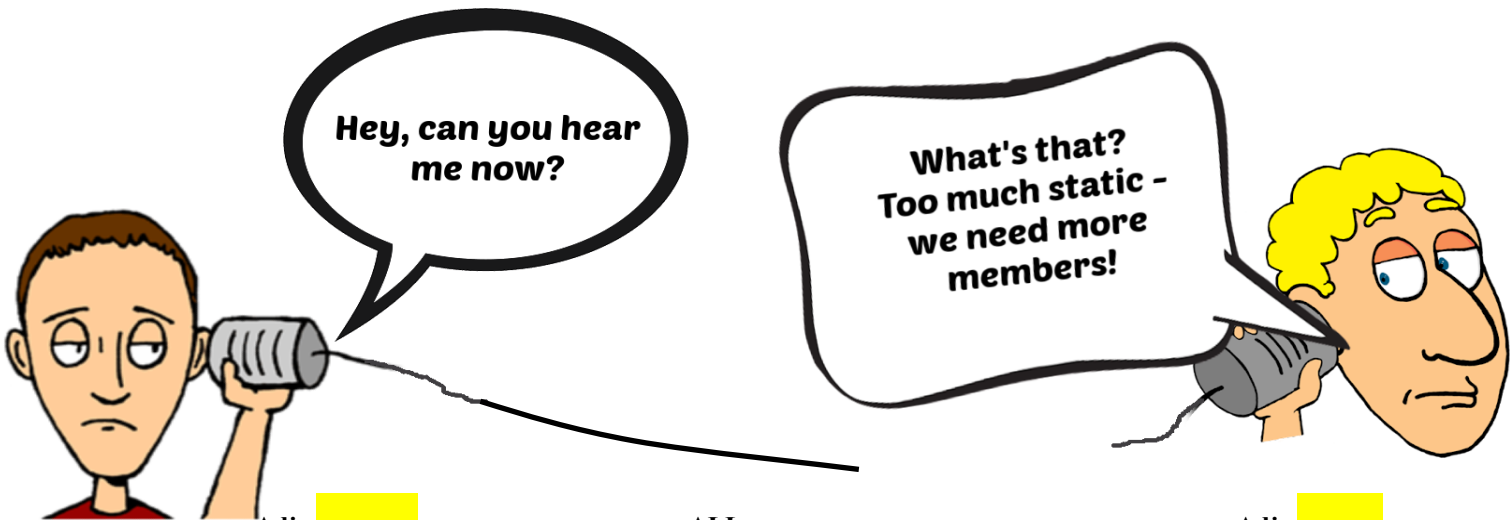
