Local VFW Service Officer David Lowe Receives National Recognition

Phoenix, AZ July 25 2023

Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) Service Officer David Lowe was recognized as the VFW Service Officer of the Year. Awarded during the VFW National Convention on 25 July 2023, Lowe was presented with the John A. Biedrzycki Accredited Service Representative of the Year for 2022-23 in front of thousands of his peers and the VFW leadership.

Lowe, a Portland, OR resident is the VFW Department Service Officer for Oregon with an office collocated at the Veterans Benefits Administration (VBA) Regional Office in downtown Portland. With only two accredited service officers and an accredited volunteer, his office handles approximately 4,000 veterans per year with anywhere from 500 to 800 open claims at any one time. In addition, his office provides training and guidance to the 70 Post and 11 District Service Officers located throughout the state.

The accompanying plaque reads:

"In special recognition of his exemplary achievements in support of the veterans service mission and programs of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States. Thus, earning the distinction of the VFW John A. Biedrzycki Accredited Service Representative of the Year. His remarkable and steadfast service to our nation's veterans on behalf of the VFW Department of Oregon reflects great credit upon himself, his Department, and our entire organization.

His actions make real the promise that "No One Does More for Veterans."

In 2020, Lowe was asked to step up as the Department Service Officer and has filled the role with exemplary service since. Lowe, a member of the VFW since 2012, is an Army veteran and served in Iraq 2006-07. Lowe also serves as the Post Commander of Gresham United VFW Post 180 in Gresham, OR. He is also a member of the Disabled American Veterans (DAV) Chapter 1 in Portland.

Lowe spoke briefly upon receipt of his award, praising his fellow Accredited Service Officers. Lowe also pointed out the VFW tag line "No One Does More for Veterans" is exemplified by the work done by the VFW Accredited Service Officers world-wide. He pointed out Accredited Service Representatives help change veterans lives. "Serving our veterans at the Veterans Service Office is one of the most important things we do in the VFW." The VFW provides services to veterans at no charge.

Commander in Chief Tim Borland's introduction of the John A. Biedrzycki Accredited Service Representative of the year David Lowe on Monday, July 24, 2023 at the joint opening session:

Comrades, ladies and gentlemen, it is with great pleasure that we get to honor an exceptional individual whose unwavering dedication and outstanding contributions have earned him the prestigious title of the 2023 John A. Biedrzycki Accredited Service Representative of the Year Award.

Helping veterans attain the care and benefits they earned is what the VFW does best, and it's what we've been doing for more than one hundred and four years. So, to receive this award, one must be truly exceptional and that is the case with this year's recipient David Lowe, VFW Department of Oregon State Service Officer from Portland, Oregon.

David attended basic training at Fort Knox, Kentucky, in July of 1979, and graduated from Kemper Military School and College in May 1977. He was commissioned through R-O-T-C as a Field Artillery officer in the US Army Reserves in 1979. During his career, Army Reserves, in the Florida Army National Guard and on Active Duty. He earned his VFW eligibility during mobilization and deployment in support to Operation Iraqi Freedom from 2005 to 2007.

In 2020, David was asked by the VFW Department of Oregon Commander to step up as Department Service officer and has filled the role ever since.

As State Service Officer, David manages the Oregon Service Office, co-located with the VA Portland Regional Service Office. With only two accredited service officers and an accredited volunteer, his office handles approximately 4,000 veterans per year with anywhere from 500 to 800 open claims at any one time. In addition, his office provides training and guidance to the 70 Post and 11 District Service Officers located throughout the state.

David is still serving as Post Commander for Gresham United Post 180 and is past commander for Oregon District 15. He is also a member of Disabled American Veterans Chapter 1 in Portland.

Today, as we gather to celebrate the remarkable accomplishments of David Lowe, let us recognize his unwavering commitment, selfless service, and tireless efforts to improve the lives of our veterans. He has truly embodied the core values of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, and we are honored to present him with this well-deserved recognition for his outstanding contributions and unwavering dedication to our nation's heroes.

I had a few Auxiliaries ask questions about this program at the academies. Below are a couple of those questions with the answers that were provided. Hopefully, I will be able to add other questions and answers throughout the year.

- **Q:** What if our Auxiliary is asked to volunteer at another organization's event, but we have not voted to partner with them, and the event is before our next meeting.
- **A:** Go ahead and volunteer at the event, wear something identifying you as VFWA, name tag, auxiliary shirt or VFWA member pin. Then at your next meeting vote to add the organization as a partner. At this point, report your hours and miles.
- **Q:** Our Auxiliary partners with Quilts of Valor. Some go and make quilts at the organization meeting place; a few others make them at home. Is this Auxiliary Outreach?
- **A:** Yes and No. For those making quilts at the Organizations meeting place report the # of people, hours, and miles under Auxiliary Outreach. The others who make quilts at home report the # of people & hours to Veterans & Family Support.
- **Q:** We partnered with another organization. But the volunteers have been told no VFWA name tags, official shirts, etc. How can they identify themselves as VFWA?
- **A:** How about wearing your membership pin or do you have any jewelry with the VFWA logo? Sometimes you just have to think outside the box.

I am looking forward to seeing more reports and I am excited to see what your Auxiliary is doing in your community.

Thank God it is September. August was a whirlwind of travel and visiting with our brothers and sisters all over the state at the Learning Academies. I had the best time and learned so much. I hope that you did too.

September also brings us to Suicide Awareness month. We have all heard the statistic that 22 veterans a day die by their own hand. This is truly heartbreaking and unacceptable. We all should be aware every day, not just in the month of September.

I can hear in my head you ask, "but what can we do to help?" Being aware of the issue is a start. But further, do you know the signs? Do you know where to call to get someone help? What can you do to help raise awareness?

Recognize and being aware of the signs of suicidal thoughts in a person. Some are obvious and some are not so blatant. Some behaviors to look for include talking about wanting to die or having profound guilt or shame. Talking about being a burden. Talking about feeling hopeless or having no reason to live.

Changing behavior is another key that someone is in potential distress and could be suicidal. Behaviors such as increased substance abuse, making a plan or searching for ways to die. Withdrawing from friends and family. Engaging in risk taking behaviors.

If you know someone is displaying the previous signs, what do you do? ASK them, "Are you thinking of killing yourself?" Be calm and LISTEN to them. Don't judge and don't argue with them. Use supportive and encouraging comments. Be honest and expedite getting them help. Suggest that they call the Veterans Crisis Line, 1-800-273-8255 or easier, text 988.

Raising awareness is a key piece in helping decrease veteran suicide awareness. Wear the Auxiliary blue tear drop pin. It is a great tool to open a discussion when someone asks what it is or what does it represent. Creating an information board and putting it up in your Post or other public place is another easy idea. Host a Suicide Awareness training or luncheon. These are just some possible suggestions. Remember to go to the Action Corp website and check out the pending legislative section. Interesting information. Also check out the Oregon representative to see what they are up to and check out the National representatives. You can see how they are voting on pending legislation.

• **Disabled Veterans Tax Termination Act**-this bill modifies provisions related to military retired pay. Specifically, the bill authorizes veterans with a service-connected disability of less than 50% to concurrently receive both retired pay and disability compensation. The bill also makes qualified disability retirees with less than 20 years of retirement-creditable service eligible for concurrent receipt, subject to specified reductions in retired pay.

To amend title 10, United States Code, to permit retired members of the Armed Forces who have a service-connected disability rated less than 50 percent to receive concurrent payment of both retried pay and veterans' disability compensation, to extend eligibility for concurrent receipt to chapter 61 disability retirees with less than 20 years of service.

1/12/2023 it was introduced in House.

1/12/2023 Referred to the Committee on Armed Services, and in addition to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker. In each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.

2/8/2023 Referred to the Subcommittee on disability Assistance and Memorial Affairs.

• **Major Richard Star Act.** This bill allows a veteran with a combat-related disability and fewer than 20 years of creditable service to receive retirement pay, without reduction, concurrent with disability compensation.

Oregon Senators Jeff Merkley and Ron Wyden are cosponsors of this bill. It was introduced in the Senate on 2/9/2023 and read twice and referred to the Committee on Armed Services on the same day.

• Suicide Act – Daniel J. Harvey Jr. and Adam Lambert Improving Service Member Transition to Reduce Veteran Suicide Act. This bill requires the Department of Defense and Department of Veterans Affairs to jointly carry out a five-year pilot program to assess the feasibility and advisability of providing certain services and a module comprised of specified elements as part of the pre-separation transition process for members of the Armed Forces for the purpose of reducing the incidence of suicide among veterans.

1/30/2023 Introduced in Senate.

1/30/2023 Read twice and referred to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs.

2/16/2023 Committee on Veterans' Affairs. Ordered to be reported with an amendment in the nature or a substitute favorably.

HISTORY TO CONSIDER:

- September 13, 1788, Congress authorized the first national election for January 1789.

- In 2004, Public Law 1008-447, Section 111 was passed requiring the following:
- "each federal agency or department shall provide educational and training materials concerning the United States Constitution to each employee. on September 17 of each year."
- **September 17 CITIZENSHIP DAY** observed annually. Wide VFW participation.
- September 24, 1789, U.S. Supreme Court established.
