## The Vietnam Veterans Memorial at the State Capitol in Salem Becomes a Reality!

On Friday, November 22, 2024, the Vietnam Veterans War Memorial was dedicated at the Oregon Capitol Grounds in Salem. After seven years of planning, raising funds and overseeing the construction, the Oregon Capitol Vietnam Veterans Memorial is now a reality. Congratulations to all who worked tirelessly to create this sacred place to honor our Vietnam veterans on our Capitol grounds. Steve Bates, Vietnam War Memorial Fund President, has worked tirelessly for nearly a decade to ensure completion.

I was honored to provide remarks at the Ceremony with many of my brothers and sisters who have served in uniform. For me, this memorial is personal as I remember my stepfather, Corporal Donald Perkey, who joined the US Army, at 17, his Senior Year of high school. He earned two bronze stars and was a rifle sharp shooter. He returned home physically from Vietnam but never quite mentally.

At the ceremony, we recognized the 791 Oregonians who were Killed in Action and the four families from Oregon who lost two sons in the Vietnam War. The Vietnam War is second only to World War II as the deadliest engagement for Oregon citizens. To those who served in the Vietnam War and never received a thank you, I say Welcome Home. It was my distinct pleasure to honor you at the ceremony.

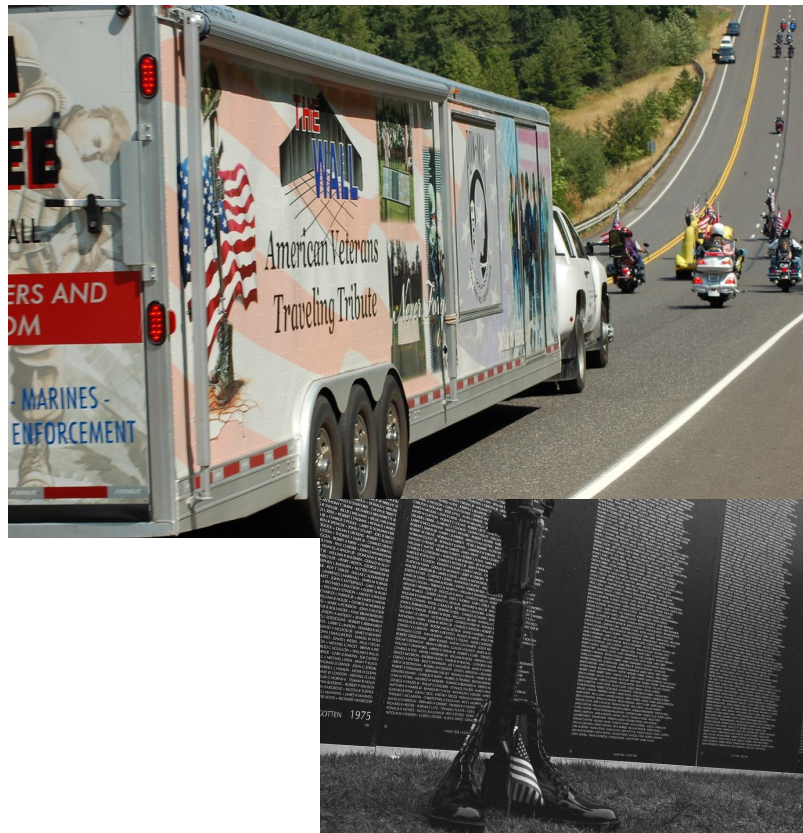
### THE WALL THAT HEALS WILL BE COMING TO INDEPENDENCE, OREGON, SEPTEMBER 18-21, 2025

Veterans Day 1996, the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund unveiled a replica of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Washington, D.C., designed to travel to communities throughout the United States. Since its dedication, The Wall that Heals has been displayed at nearly 700 communities throughout the nation, spreading the Memorial's healing legacy to millions.

Bringing the Wall home to communities throughout our country allows the souls enshrined on the Memorial to exist once more among family and friends in the peace and comfort of familiar surroundings. The traveling exhibit provides thousands of veterans who have been unable to cope with the prospect of facing The Wall to find strength and courage to do so within their own communities, thus allowing the healing process to begin.

*The Wall that Heals* exhibit features a three-quarter scale replica of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Washington, D.C. The Replica is 375 feet in length and stands 7.5 feet high at its tallest point. Visitors experience The Wall rising above them as they walk towards the apex, a key feature of the design of The Wall in D.C.

Like the original Memorial, *The Wall That Heals* is erected in a chevron-shape and visitors can do name rubbings of individual service member's names on The Wall. The replica is constructed of Avonite, a synthetic granite, and its 140 numbered panels are supported by an aluminum frame. Machine engravings of the more than 58,000 names along with modern LED lighting provide readability of The Wall day and night.

## VFW POST 10580 AND AUXILIARY IN WARRENTON SERVING IN THEIR COMMUNITY!



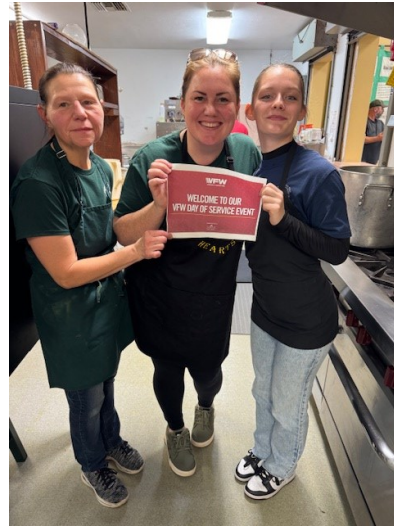

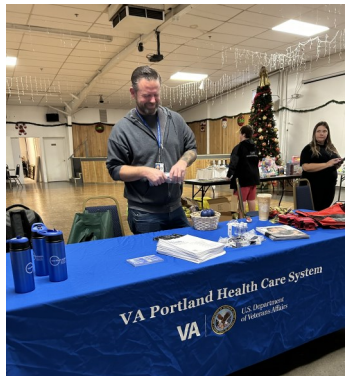
