Voice of Democracy

Established in 1947, our Voice of **Democracy** audio-essay program provides high school students with the unique opportunity to express themselves in regard to a democratic and patriotic-themed recorded essay.

Each year, nearly 40,000 9-12 grade students from across the country enter to win their share of more than \$1.9 million in educational scholarships and incentives awarded through the program.

The national first-place winner receives a \$30,000 scholarship paid directly to the recipient's American university, college or vocational/technical school.

District 8: Mackenzie Dunn



he has been there since 2013. Before teaching **Dan** was in the guitar and surfboard industry as CNC programmer and designer for over 20 years. When he started at Redmond High School there was no manufacturing program and the



welding program did not have any students for at least 10 years. **Dan** is the Manufacturing Technology teacher for the Career and Technical Education (CTE) department. **Dan** started these class 5 years by writing a grant for \$487,000 to allow the school to get specialized equipment computers, CAD program design and cost analysis, cutting and welding machines, sanding and polishing machines. **Dan** has articulated all the classes with COCC as well as Oregon Tech so that students here at RHS can earn college credits at a heavily discounted rate. Students also can enter post-secondary with almost 1 full year of credits completed towards their degree. His class worked with many different organizations throughout community doing hands on projects to local fire districts, designed and fabricated custom signs for the Bend International School, built new Redmond High School signs, Dan teaches his students how to design and machine custom billet aluminum bullet boxes. The students that take his class can earn industry certifications in the CAD, Solidworks Associate Degree, Cam Mastercam Associates and with the NIMS (National Institute for Metalworking Skills) Community recognized Dan by TV News Channel 21 (one class at a time) of a \$500.00 to use towards "The Bike for Life program where RHS students created special bikes for kids to learn how to ride. Dan says I never in my life imagined I would be a teacher, I now cannot imagine being anything but a Teacher, I love my Job.
