How do you Eat an Elephant?

One of the most daunting tasks this year is going to be reaching your membership goals. It is almost like eating an elephant. So how do you take on this task? Simply put, to meet your membership goals and achieve over 100 percent membership, tackle it like you would if you had to eat an elephant, one bite at a time.

We are asking that you try to achieve four percent growth every month. This four percent represents a bite out of membership. This four percent can come from new members or expiring members, but if your post can do that every month, you will hit 100 percent and department will reach 100 percent membership this year. Membership consists of two parts, getting new members and retaining the members you already have.

Recruiting new members is difficult this year but not impossible. Most of our new membership comes from recruiting booths and fairs and other community events. Since those have been cancelled this year, we need to go back to basics and recruit where we

and neither the Government nor the Hotel change anything. I am hopeful that we can gather together once again.

One of the problems that has been coming up around the State this year is divisions within the Post. There have been several different reasons for this. Some differences are simple differences of opinion or personalities. Some have been centered around the canteen. I would like to remind everyone that at the beginning of our meetings we are instructed, “Do not let petty jealousies or trivial personalities influence our deliberations. Let us uphold always the obligations of unselfish comradeship and loyalty to our organization and to the government of the United States of America.” If you cannot remember hearing this, maybe you need to get out of the bar and get in the meeting. It is apparent to me that with all the pressures of the COVID-19 some members’ nerves are on edge. This does not mean that it is a free ride to bad behavior. Nor is PTSD; if you feel the stress is coming on, back off and seek help. Do not use PTSD as an excuse for flying off the handle at anyone. If as veterans we want the public to take us seriously, we must be able to control our emotions and our actions.

We all have an opinion and often feel free to share it with others. If you are going to share your opinion, be ready to “agree to disagree” because the other person may not care about your opinion. That is okay. What is theirs is theirs, and what is yours is yours. Look for things you can all agree on instead of those you do not. If you have trouble getting along with others after having a few drinks, maybe you need to have a few less. You may find that the problem is not other people as much as what you have been drinking. Nor do you need to antagonize those under stress or someone else who has had too much to drink. I was once told that it takes two to fight.

As all Commanders have been in the past, I am concerned with membership. I know that we have trouble getting out to do recruiting events. We need to speak to those veterans in the parking lot when we go to the store, in a restaurant we are eating in, or wherever we can find them. We need to keep doing the welfare checks on our members. Know whether they are Life Members or Annual Members. Know whether they have paid their annual dues for this year or not. Remind them that we need them to keep their membership. Explain to them how to become a life member if they are an annual member. If you are going to take information to the Quartermaster on a new Life member or an Annual member transferring to Life who plans to use the installment plan to pay their Life dues, make sure the member knows that National will send them an email before they start charging payments to the member’s card. The member must respond to that email or National will not proceed with the monthly deductions. Also remind them that if the card they used to start the payment plan changes or is cancelled, the member is responsible for providing National with a new card number. National does not call or contact anyone if the card stops working; it is the member’s responsibility to make sure the card that National has is good. Also, make sure the member is aware that if they do the payment plan, they will not receive their Life Member card until installment plan payments are complete. Until then they will receive an Annual Member card.

I would ask that each Post look at those members who are in need. Some are disabled, some may be out of work or some may be of an age

when their income no longer covers all their bills as it once did. Each Post must decide who they can help and who they cannot. I know that many Posts had as much success with the Buddy Poppy drive this year as in past years, so relief funds maybe thinner than normal. I would ask that each Post try not to leave a member behind if it is in the Post’s power to prevent it.

In closing I ask that everyone stay safe. Call a Post member to let them know how you are doing. And keep up the good fight. For as they say, NO ONE DOES MORE FOR VETERANS.

can. Always have those applications with you ready to be filled out. This is the year to approach your neighbors or to start a conversation with those people you see at the grocery store wearing veteran hats or coming out of a car with campaign license plates. You may not be able to get them all, but a bite at a time is all it takes.

The second half of membership is retention. Retention would be easy if after the membership year ends on June 30, every annual member would pay their dues on July 1st. That is not possible for most, and this means the post needs to wait to see who will stay in and who will let their dues lapse as the year rolls out. You need to go online and look at your expiring members list on the national website. You need to contact those expiring this month and all that expired in past months and convince them their membership is important. Develop a plan of action to contact these members, either with email messages, direct mailings, phone calls or home visits. A combination of all these methods will need to be utilized because different people respond to different methods.

You can decrease the number of those not interested in staying by remembering that “**retention begins when they sign up.**” The easiest way to retain a member is when they show up to a meeting and they learn firsthand what you are doing in the community. However, if they do not show up to meetings you must communicate with them in other ways to let them know that your post is working hard in the community for veterans. It is a chance to show that the sales pitch they received when they signed up was true. If you do not have a newsletter that includes this information, a letter should go out at least once a year highlighting your accomplishments. More expedient methods include emails and Facebook posts, but not all members will read emails or other electronic media. Do not let the first time they hear from you be when you are asking for this year’s dues.

Depending on your post size, four percent of your unpaid members is not that many members. Sometimes it is only one member, sometimes it is six members. Either way, taking a little bite out every month, is easier than trying to do it all in May.

CHIEF OF STAFF

Greetings Comrades. Before you know it, the current program year will be done. I know it has become easy for us to lay back and blame the current Pandemic for our inability to get our programs done and reach our membership goals of being 100% plus 1, however to be considered All State, Posts will need 100% plus one to meet the quota cited in the State Commander's Membership Program listed in the Department's Roster Book.

Realistically, we are prohibited in most areas from hosting recruiting events. That means we must, even if it is distasteful or time consuming, call all our members to check on their welfare and remind them that their membership is invaluable and necessary for us to carry on our advocacy for all veterans' rights. If you are a Post Commander, Quartermaster, or Adjutant that has trouble contacting people, look around at your membership. There are a few members, like me, who know it is the right thing to do for our membership and the VFW, even though it might feel like we are begging.

When we contact members, we often find that they are struggling and would qualify as a hardship. Our relief fund allows us to pay hardship member dues. We should also confirm their address and make sure they are receiving the National magazine. Sometimes you find that a member has died, and records need to be updated. It may be uncomfortable, but it is the right thing to do for our membership and the VFW.

Find comrades that can talk to our membership and give them a list of names to call. Your Quartermaster can print out a copy of phone numbers and emails. Utilize this list to get it done. If your Quartermaster cannot generate a list for you, you can call Headquarters or me. We can assist you in generating a call list. This is the lifeline that has been thrown out for us to use. Grab hold and let us get this Department to 100% as rapidly as we can. We have a great State Commander. We must support him by reaching our membership and program goals.

OREGON POW-MIA HIGHWAY SIGNS DEDICATED

Oregon veterans dedicated the nation's first border-to-border POW/MIA Memorial Highway in a series of ceremonies across the state on September 18, 2020 - National POW/MIA Recognition Day. The designation of U.S. Highway 26 honors 920 Oregon prisoners of war, including 135 civilians, 999 Oregon military veterans and one civilian listed as missing in action. The project was spearheaded by Dick Tobiason, chairman of the Bend Heroes Foundation.

Chapter 392 helped organize one of these events which was held in Boring, Oregon. The ceremony was hosted at Jaycee Newman Nursery and organized by the Vietnam Veterans of America Oregon State Council and its Portland Chapter 392. The Sandy Veterans of Foreign Wars Post No. 4273 and its auxiliary assisted. The ceremony location was adjacent to the Highway 26/Highway 212 interchange, where the two Boring signs were installed (eastbound and westbound).

Clackamas County Commissioners Paul Savas and Sonya Fischer were in attendance along with representatives from the American Legion Department of Oregon, Veterans of Foreign Wars Department of Oregon and its Auxiliary, Vietnam Veterans of America and the National League of POW-MIA Families.

Steve Bates of the Boring Committee on Memorials and Remembrance served as the master of ceremonies of the event. "May these signs cause honor and remembrance of the missing and their families and may these signs cause a greater knowledge and remembrance of the missing," Bates said.

Dick Lovegren, the Oregon coordinator for the National League of POW-MIA Families, gave a presentation at the ceremony. Lovegren's brother is still missing in Vietnam.

BEND CBOC RENAMED TO HONOR WWII MEDAL OF HONOR RECIPIENT

10/26/20 to 5/11/2019

The following article was submitted by Dick Tobiason, a local veteran and President of "Bend Heroes Foundation."

Quote from the White House:

"On Tuesday, October 13, 2020, the President signed into law: S. 4072, which designates the clinic of the Department of Veterans Affairs in Bend, Oregon, as the Robert D. Maxwell Department of Veterans Affairs Clinic."

As Mr. Maxwell's Veterans Agent for 16 years, I am delighted the Oregon delegation in Washington, DC accepted my October 1, 2018 request for that renaming.

When I asked Bob Maxwell two- and one-half years ago for his approval for the renaming he replied, "Ok, as long as that does not stop veterans from visiting the clinic."

Bob was pleased I also requested in the same letter 4 more VA facilities be renamed:

Portland VA Medical Center: Stuart S. Stryker and Elmer E. Fryar – both WWII KIAs

Salem VA Clinic: Henry Schauer – WWII Survivor from Bob's 3rd Infantry Division

Eugene VA Healthcare Center - Maximo Yabes – KIA Vietnam

La Grande VA Clinic: John Noble Holcomb – KIA Vietnam

Elmer Fryar's parents accepted his posthumous award in the same ceremony in Denver when Bob Maxwell received his Medal of Honor award. Fryar still remains MIA.

As Elmer Fryar is not honored at the Medal of Honor memorials at the Capitol building and on the ODVA grounds in Salem, I was successful in getting agreements to add him.

Thanks Oregon delegation and staff for honoring Mr. Maxwell!

After looking at inspection reports, it was brought to my attention that some of you do not know what needs to be included in your secretary's book. (Yes, you must have a book or three-ring binder to keep the information for the secretary in.)

The following should be part of your secretary arsenal:

Minutes book or Three-Ring Binder

Treasurer's report and copies of audits. All must be incorporated in the minutes. You must include when audits are sent to Department Treasurer.

Copy of Bond showing President and Treasurer Bonded.

Roll call book.

Folder for newsletters, correspondence, and/or Bulletins from Current District Presidents. Include General orders from the National and Department.

List of Auxiliary Chairman.

YOU ARE REQUIRED TO KEEP THIS INFORMATION FOR 6 YEARS.

If you are no longer a secretary, you must pass all books over to the new secretary. They are not yours to keep once you are no longer in that position.

You are to call roll at every meeting, whether in place or virtual.

If you type minutes on the computer, you must have a 3-ring binder to keep minutes organized. When you have an audit or inspection, they need to be readily available to be looked at and BE SIGNED BY AUDIT TEAM and inspecting officers.

You must read correspondence received and check the Oregon VFW Auxiliary website for President's message, National Orders, and news from Dept. Chairmen.

I hope that this will help in doing your job as a secretary. If you need any assistance, please email or call.

National Program Book (available for download at vfwauxiliary.org).

Department Program Book and Current year's Department General Orders (if applicable)

Order of Business/Agenda prepared with the assistance of Secretary and Treasurer prior to meeting

Chairman Reports to be distributed prior to meeting.

Arrive early to check that the room is prepared for meeting:

Charter, Gavel, Altar Cloth, Bible, Flag stands properly placed

Start and end the meeting as scheduled.

A clock on the podium will help achieve the suggested one-hour time. Hint: Set a timer!

You can also use a phone/text tree to remind members about meetings and events with your Auxiliary. The President first calls or texts the Senior Vice-President and Junior Vice-President. Then each of them would call/text the next person down on the tree, and so on and so forth. Each member would only have one other person to contact. This is another way to communicate with your Auxiliary members.

District Presidents make sure you are finishing your Auxiliary inspections and get your paperwork back to Madam President Debra Wright.

In true Mib Dailey style, the crowd was entertained with gusto! Mib worked a six-time







Great Veteran Organizations working together for a joint endeavor ...

The Veterans of Foreign Wars and the American Legion have an opportunity to work together creating the American Legion - Veterans of Foreign Wars Memorial Highway on US Hwy 30. Hwy 30 not only runs border to border in Oregon, but it also extends across the country, covering a total of 3,073 miles and 11 states. It is the only border to border highway in Oregon that has not been designated as a Veterans Highway.

Based on the costs of the POW/MIA Memorial Highway signs, 10-12 American Legion-Veterans of Foreign Wars Memorial Highway signs along US Hwy 30 in Oregon would cost about \$20,000-\$24,000.

There are ample justifications for an American Legion – Veterans of Foreign Wars Memorial Highway in Oregon and they can be easily turned into the necessary “Whereas” clauses for legislation. Dick Tobiason, member of VFW Post 4108 and the Bend Heroes Foundation has offered to help someone at the Department level draft legislation if the Departments agree to seek legislation.

We will need to consider how we can start raising money to help with the cost of the signs. This is a great way to honor our past, current and future members.
