





Department Dashboard featuring Camp Alma

A lot of attention this year has been centered on the National Dashboard, which tracks your post's progress towards becoming an All-American Post. There is one more Dashboard that needs to be looked at as well and that is the Department Dashboard, or better known as the Pink and Purple Monster which tracks your progress towards reaching All-State status. This dashboard is on the Department's webpage, and it is included with this newsletter. This should be tracked by the post leadership and if it is not updated let Department know. This needs to be done regularly so that at the end of the year, it is not too late.

Even though as a department we have had our Pink and Purple Monster for almost a decade, the National Dashboard is relatively new. Both tools are used for the same reason, and both tools need to be understood. Each item on these dashboards needs to be understood, like the Commander's Project on the All-State Dashboard. The first way to understand them is to know what each criterion requires to be considered complete. Neither of these are going away and will constantly be changing every year in hopes to improve their ease of use, but until then, be assured both Department and National is there to help you get them updated for your post.

In this issue our State Surgeon Andrea Summerlin wrote about a visit the line officers and others had at Camp Alma. The reason this article is important and how it ties in with the All-State Dashboard is that a donation to Camp Alma through Department Headquarters is not only a great idea to help them with their mission, but also important because can satisfy a requirement to make All-State.

I am asking for a \$50 donation from each post. This money will go towards a new industrial dishwasher at Camp Alma. The kitchen is a commercial kitchen and is set up to cook for and feed a large group of people, but the current dishwasher is just not set up to do their dishes afterwards.

Camp Alma's Board of Directors goal is to be able to house and reintegrate up to 30 veterans at a time and with our help they will be closer to making that goal a reality. There will be representative of the camp at our Mid-Winter Banquet. He will be giving a short presentation outlining the camp's vision and goals to help with veteran homelessness. There will also be a table set-up in the lobby to answer questions. I hope you will be able to talk with the representative and maybe even schedule a trip to visit their operation outside of Eugene.








The pictures above are of Camp Alma outside of Eugene, Oregon.

Gulf War Veterans:

Gulf War presumptive conditions now include respiratory issues such as Chronic Sinusitis, Rhinitis, and/or Asthma. The condition must have persisted for at least 6 months

To qualify you must have served in the Persian Gulf Region on or before 31 December 2021, be diagnosed with one or more of these conditions, that manifested within 10 years of qualifying service. Persian Gulf Region includes Iraq, Kuwait, Saudi Arabia, the neutral zone between Iraq and Saudi Arabia Bahrain, Qatar, and the United Arab Emirates (U.A.E.) Oman The Gulf of Aden and the Gulf of Oman, The waters of the Persian Gulf, the Arabian Sea, and the Red Sea and the airspace above these locations. Persian Gulf Region does not include Afghanistan nor Horn of Africa.

Changes in the Intent To File (ITF):

Intent to File (VA Form 21-0966) preserves the effective date of claim for one year. It is used when a veteran wishes to file a claim but does not have all the evidence needed.

Prior to 1 July 2021, the Intent to File only preserved the Effective Date of Claim for Original and New Claims.

After 1 July, the ITF will also preserve the effective date of claim for Substantive Appeals and Supplemental Claims. Please contact your post service officer if you have questions.

As the holiday season quickly approaches, this officer would like to remind members of the importance of staying healthy. The next few months are normally filled with festive fun and an extensive list of obligations. Here are several health and wellness tips from Dr. Ashley Lucas, Registered Dietitian, to get through the holidays:

Find calm in what you can control Make sleep a priority Do not be hard on yourself Stay moving (or start moving) Have a positive attitude Be mindful of what you are eating Stay connected in your community Tap into your support system

One way of giving back is to donate blood. The American Red Cross currently has an emergency blood and platelet shortage as the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic continue to challenge the nation's blood supply. Donor turnout has reached the lowest levels of the year, with the past few months having the lowest national blood inventory levels in more than a decade.

Donating blood is essential to help save the lives of patients who are depending on the availability of blood this winter. Eligible donors of all blood types – especially type O blood, are needed to ensure critical patient needs are met. Make an appointment to give blood or platelets by visiting www.redcross.org or calling 1-800-733-2767.

Have you noticed that there is another way to communicate and provide health and wellness information to members? If you are on social media, search for the Facebook VFW Department of Oregon Surgeon page and follow it. Information and resources from VA, ODVA, VFW, and other agencies will be posted there for members. If you have any ideas or suggestions on topics to post on the page, feel free to let this officer know.

A new incentive for posts this year is the Golden Stethoscope Award. This award will recognize the contributions Surgeons make in their posts and communities. Surgeons are the heartbeat of veteran health and wellness programs. Other criteria will be hospital and/or nursing home visitations, assisting with or donating in blood drives, arranging transportation for veteran medical appointments, and promoting health and well-being to the membership. In early October, several Department officers and invited guests were provided a private tour and lunch at the Veterans Legacy Camp Alma. The tour was led by Dan Buckwald, an Air Force veteran, Executive Director and Founder, who managed the camp for thirteen years as his role in the Lane County Sheriff's Office.

Camp Alma is a former Lane County corrections facility in the coast range, about 45 minutes west of Eugene. The camp sits on 117 acres of land in a peaceful valley and is a hidden gem after several miles of winding and narrow roads. Camp Alma is named after the area's first settler. Dan shared with the group that "the land has healing powers" and their focus is on readjustment and transition from the military.

Nationally, an average of twenty-two veterans commit suicide every day. Oregon's rate is one of the highest in the nation, and Lane County has the highest percentage of homeless veterans in the state. Dan went on to share that Lane County has over 30,000 veterans and that "19.1 percent of our prison population are veterans, so we really need to look at how we are addressing that."

Veterans Legacy Oregon is a local nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization founded in 2016 to provide integrative treatment in a rural setting to area veterans. Their vision is to break the cycle of veteran suicides, mental health disorders and social costs from the underserved experiencing PTSD, substance abuse and associated traumas.

Multiple resources are used to address the medical and psychological needs of veterans in a therapeutic agricultural setting at Camp Alma. Veterans Legacy philosophy is that healing and wellness is a function of a safe environment, meaningful therapeutic experiences, and a multifaceted, community-based system of extended care. The camp can host up to thirty male veterans at one time. A future goal is to build tiny houses for female homeless veterans.

It is important to note that Camp Alma is not a "rehab program" according to the staff. It is a place for veterans to heal by reestablishing community, social skills, and self-worth. Veterans heal themselves by working in the garden, learning new skills, and building projects that will make the camp be self-sufficient. Fishing in the Siuslaw River, which borders the camp, is allowed and veterans enjoy the peace and quiet of the environment.

Some of the diverse options offered at Camp Alma or with their community partners include music, art, fly fishing, tai chi, sailing, and agriculture and greenhouse therapy. Staff members said that there are always things to do at the camp such as tending to the bees, collecting eggs, feeding the animals, cooking & cleaning.

All those in attendance found the tour to be engaging and options were discussed on how the VFW could assist Camp Alma in reaching more veterans. More information can be found on their website: https://www.veteranslegacyoregon.org/

News from District 13 Commander Bob Beck:

Department of Oregon's District 13 participated in the Memorial Service for US Air Force Major Paul A. Avolese, MIA from the Vietnam War. Maj. Avolese's B52 crashed 7 July 1967 in the S. China Sea off Vietnam while on a bombing run; his remains were not recovered until 2020.

District Commander Bob Beck, LTC, USA, Retired, has worked with Maj. Avolese's grown children over the past two months, as well as the USAF Mortuary Affairs Branch, Dover AFB, DE; the USAF Honor Guard from JB Lewis-McChord, WA; and the USO, Portland Airport, OR. The District Adjutant, Gene Lord, coordinated with the Patriot Guard Riders to escort the funeral party from the Portland Airport to the Springfield Memorial Gardens. This escort included nearly forty Riders, including Gene. Dave Miller, District Surgeon, worked with the office of Oregon's US Senator Ron Wyden for a US Flag flown over the Capitol, which Bob and Dave presented to the family two days before the memorial service. There were nearly thirty VFW Members from District 13 Posts at the memorial. The Department of Oregon Commander, Dennis Pratt, was also present.




