



Get Started on Youth Programs

Its hard to believe it's
September already and
soon another school year
will begin. That means that
the teachers will be in their
classrooms planning out their
curriculum for the school year.
This means it's time to start
planning your youth programs,
The Voice of Democracy,

Patriot's Pen and the Teachers of the Year contests.

One thing you need to do is to get in touch with the teachers, principals and administrators of your local schools and tell them about our youth programs. Now is the time since they are planning out their year. Its amazing how many of these people have never heard of these contests. In order that the school officials are excited about these programs, make sure that you are excited about these programs, and that you know all the requirements so that you can answer their questions. You can read up on this program online, or have your questions answered at one of the Schools of Instructions this

In the past, I have heard complaints that the public schools will not let these programs happen in their schools. That is sad, but there are other options available to get the word out on these programs. There are private schools, charter schools and home school students you can reach out to. There are also youth groups you can talk to like scout groups, church groups or groups like the 4H and Future Farmers of America.

The second thing to do is to plan the program within your post. Determine how much the prizes should be. Every post has different fundraising goals but remember you can use your Relief Fund for these programs. Besides the monetary awards, determine if you can get the students certificates, or other prizes, as well. The VFW catalog has many options and any bit of recognition for their participation in this program may encourage them to do it again next year.

Also, as part of your program, plan how the awards will be presented. Dropping the awards off at the school and have them deliver them is one way, but to encourage the students to enter this program again next year, do a little more for them. One possibility is to have a dinner for the winners, present the awards at a school assembly in front of their peers or present them to the winners before a post meeting. Make the time about them and make sure you show them your appreciation that they entered the contests.

The final item to be planning with your post is the contribution that will need to be made to department for these programs. This year once again the posts that are trying to be All-State will need to have not only an entry in the programs but will also have to make a monetary contribution to Department. This is to maintain the levels of prize money we have given in the past. More information about the minimum amounts will be in this year's roster, but consider giving more to keep these programs going.

So read the program guides found on the VFW website, attend a School of Instruction, talk to the various program chairs at the district and department levels and learn more about these programs to make these programs a success this year and every year.

The July 2020, 40th National Veterans Wheelchair Games are being hosted by the VA in Portland, Oregon. Approximately 600 paralyzed Veterans will be competing in this event. The Commander is challenging the Auxiliary and MOC/MOCA Auxiliaries to join us in supporting this worthy event. Department's recommended minimum involvement is as follows:

- Minimum Sponsorship \$10,000
- Purchase a 10'X10' discounted non-profit booth for recruiting and VFW information
- Volunteers

We are asking our Districts, Posts and membership to consider donating money for this worthy event. Along with the Department Auxiliary and MOC/MOCA Auxiliaries' participation in donations, we can together reach the minimum \$10,000 sponsorship. We will make sure the donation will be cited on the sponsorship submission paperwork. Our Department will recognize with a poster each District, Post, Auxiliaries and members that donate. This sign will be posted at the 10'X10' booth at this event.





Scholarship Report Fall 2019

Well a year has gone by, and now it is time to start all over again. The 2019-2020 Scholarship Program is here. We will start off by helping the VFW with their programs — the Voice of Democracy Essay Contest is for students in 9th to 12th

grades, and the Patriot's Pen Essay Contest is for students in the 6th-8th grades. The theme this year is the same for both essay contests: "What Makes America Great." Deadlines for these essays are:

Entries to VFW Post: Midnight, October 31, 2019. Post Judging complete: November 15, 2019,

District Judging complete: December 15, 2019. Department Judging complete: January 10, 2020,

Department Winner to VFW National Headquarters: January 15, 2020.

Continuing Education Scholarship

We have our own programs, the Oregon Continuing Education Scholarship, and National Continuing Education Scholarship. They both have the same criteria for the scholarship.

They are open to any Auxiliary member (who has been a member for at least one year), or spouse, son, daughter with financial need. Entrant must be at least 18 years old, complete the application, and submit an essay of 300 words or less. The application must be received at Department and National Headquarters by February 15, 2020. You will find the application online at both websites for each of the scholarships.

Young American Creative Patriotic Art Contents

Open to all students and home schooled students, grades 9-12 are eligible, no older than 18 years at the time of local entry and a U.S. citizen or U.S. National. Make sure there is no digital artwork; it will not be accepted. Artwork must be on paper or canvas to be accepted. Only one winner will be sent to National.

Expanded Art Forms Now Accepted

The Patriotic Art Contest will now accept additional forms of art. See the new rules below:

Two-dimensional art

- . Must be on canvas or paper.
- Watercolor, pencil, pastel, charcoal, tempera, crayon, acrylic, pen, ink, oil, makers or other media may be used.
- Do not frame two-dimensional pieces.
- Submit canvas entries on a stretcher frame or canvas board. Other entries must be matted in white.
- . Do not use colored mats. Reinforce the back with heavy
- Mounted and floating mats may also be used.
- . The art should be no smaller than 8" x 10" and no larger than 18"x 24", not including mat.

Three-dimensional art:

- . Can be paper, paper-maiche, pottery clay, metalwork, etc.
- . The piece should be no smaller than 8" in any direction and no larger than 24", not including mat.
- . Art cannot be more than 5 lbs. in weight.

Digital art, photography, and jewelry are not accepted.





1. National Manual of Procedure, Section 218—Officers and Chairmen, Duties and Obligations.

Duty of Commander (Post) – k. Assure that the Commander or their representative attend all properly called District Conventions or meetings.

Duty of Quartermaster (Post) – c Disburse funds as properly authorized by the Post using accepted banking practices. Unless otherwise provided for in Post By-Laws, all disbursements of Post funds shall bear the signature of the Quartermaster or other person(s) authorized by the Quartermaster. Such other authorized person(s) shall be bonded with an indemnity company as surety in a sum at least equal to the amount of the liquid assets for which the Quartermaster may be accountable in accordance with Section 703.

- 2. District Commanders: Send the Department copy of the Post Inspection Report to the Department Inspector immediately after inspection and no later than 31 October 2019. The Post copy stays with the Post. District Commanders or Inspecting Officer will be paid travel for only one Post Inspection per year.
- 3. Line Officers: All travel will be at the direction of the Department Commander. Unauthorized travel cannot be paid. Send a brief summary of travel purpose with results and/or observations to the Commander at Department Headquarters.
- 4. Post Officers, elected or appointed, shall submit proof of eligibility to the Post Adjutant. Post Officers shall not assume the duties of their office until proof of eligibility has been submitted. After sixty (60) days from election or appointment and failure to submit such proof, all rights to hold office shall be forfeited, the office declared vacant and the eligibility qualifications of such officer shall be questioned in accordance with the provision of Section 108 of the National By-Laws. (Section 216, Paragraph 2 of the National, By- Laws and Manual of Procedure pg. 70-71). District Commanders, District Senior vice Commanders and District Junior vice Commanders shall submit to the Department

Adjutant a copy of their DD-214 or proof of eligibility before assuming their elected offices.

- 5. The Quartermaster bonding year begins September 1ST. It is necessary to renew the QM Bond before this date. A new QM Bond Fees schedule will be sent to all Quartermasters. Posts with Private Club bonding must provide proof of bonding to Department Headquarters. Post not properly bonded bySeptember 1st can be put on suspension.
- 6. The Department Commander strongly urges District and Post Officers to attend the Department and District Schools of Instruction. This is the meeting to get information and ask questions. If you don't attend you may miss out. Required for All-State consideration. District Commanders will be able to pick up the District and Post packets at this time. Please let Department know which SOI you will be attending so we may have the packets ready. If you cannot attend, send a substitute.
- 7. Section 403 of the Manual of Procedure clearly indicates that Districts shall hold at least two (2) regular meeting each year for the purpose of transacting business and conducting schools of instruction. Each District shall hold an annual District Convention for the purpose of electing District officers and for the transaction of business. (For a total of 3 meetings)
- 8. District and Post Quartermasters: When receiving a check from Department, deposit it immediately so we can keep our bookkeeping up to date. There is a sixty (60) day period on Department checks. If you miss this date, thank you.
- 9. The National Life Member Board of Trustees, pursuant to Section 111 of the VFW Bylaws, has determined that for the 2019 2020 membership year, the Life Membership Fund will pay out \$3.50 for each Plan A, B and C, \$3.86for each Plan D and \$8.36 for each plan E Life member to their Post. Payment will be made in September 2019 for all life members recorded as of 31 August 2019. For life members processed from September through December 2019, the \$8.36 payout will be made in January 2020.

- 10. Attention is directed to Section 709 of the National By-Laws and Manual of Procedure, paragraph two (2). Any Post owning and/or operating, directly or by reason of a holding company or other entity substantially controlled by the Post or its members, a canteen, clubroom or other facility available to members or guests must maintain general liability insurance, including, if necessary or appropriate, liquor liability insurance. Such insurance must be of a type and amount sufficient to protect the Post and must name, as additional insured's, the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States and the Department in which such Post is located.
- 11. Attention is called to the provisions of Section 703 of the National By-Laws which require that each officer accountable for funds or property pursuant to any provision of these By-Laws shall be bonded with an indemnity company as surety in a sum at least equal to the amount of the liquid assets for which, so far as can be anticipated, he may be accountable. The bond premium shall be paid from the funds of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States, Department, District, County Council or Post, as the case may be, to which each officer is accountable. The bonds of such accountable officers, in amount and as to surety, shall be approved by their respective units and held by their respective Commanders. The Commander of each unit shall be responsible for the proper and adequate bonding of all accountable officers in his unit.
