What Should Your Goal Be?

Post Commanders: Now is the time to start planning

It's May already; that means a new class of post officers have been elected and are ready to take charge of their posts and lead them during the 2019-2020 year. If you are a new post commander, I want to say thank you

for taking on this new challenge. If you are a returning commander, keep up the good work. Either way, now is the time for next year's post leadership to plan their year and set goals for their posts.

I was at a district meeting a couple of weeks ago and they elected the new officers for this coming year. After the elections, the new district commander got up and said what was their expectations: "My goal is to be an All-American Commander." I thought that it was great that the commander had a goal in mind and communicated that to the district.

Have you have some goals in mind for your post? Whether you are a new commander this year or you are a seasoned post commander, to make your tenure in office fulfilling, you should have something you want to achieve while you hold that office.

What should your goals be? A good place to start is to look at the requirements for All-State and All-American or look at what your post has accomplished the last few years and use that as a starting point. Whatever you decide them to be, the first step is to clearly define your goals. You need to make sure everyone in your post understands them. Get feedback from your post and revise the goals so that they are clearly understood. You also need to give the goals context. Ask yourself why are they important and what happens if you do not achieve them, and what happens if you do achieve them? Think of the answers in the short term and in the long term beyond this membership year.

The next step you need do is to figure out what resources you need in place to make the goals happen. This includes the funding of your initiatives, the incremental pre-steps of the final goal, the timing of each step and the members you will need help from. You may need to plan on doing a fundraiser to accomplish these goals which will require extra planning. In order to determine the timing of when you should have these goals done, think of when the deadline to achieve these goals is, and the incremental blocks that must be reached before the final goal is reached, and then plan each step. Finally, know how many people and how much time will need to be spent to get the job. You can even chart the process out to keep everything organized.

After you have established your goals for this year, make sure everyone in the post knows what they are. Every person must have the same level of understanding of the goals. If your goals are not understood there will be potential for your members to disregard them. Make sure you bring the goals up at every meeting throughout the year to publicize your progress at the post meeting. Everyone likes to keep score and your post members would like to know if they are winning or losing. Each incremental block and each goal should have a target date so that the progress can be tracked during the year. It keeps them interested in the project, and gives them motivation to do more.

By working through these steps, your post will be able to achieve its goals. But remember, progress is not always easy. It will take all hands and dedication to achieve your goals and elevate your post, but when a post can achieve its goals the members become proud to be a member of your post and proud to be members of the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

VFW Foundation's Home Depot Foundation Community Impact Grant Completion Guide 2019-2020

Please read through all information in this guide before beginning the application so you will become acquainted with the general rules and process. Do not worry that your Post is not a registered 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization. You can still apply as a 501(19), nonprofit, veterans group.

You may access the application using the link found at the bottom of this article.

Once you have begun the application ,try to complete it in one session without saving. We have received multiple reports that using the "Save and Finish Later" option has led to a loss of work and applicants had to re-enter parts of the application.

It is strongly recommend that you copy your answers to a separate document after completing the essay style questions.

PLEASE NOTE: There is a new requirement in applying for the Home Depot Community Impact grant this year. Applicants must provide a project budget via a Microsoft Excel file. Details and an example on how to do this can be found on pages 13-19 of this document. You will submit the Project Budget on the same page of the application that you upload your IRS determination letter/990.

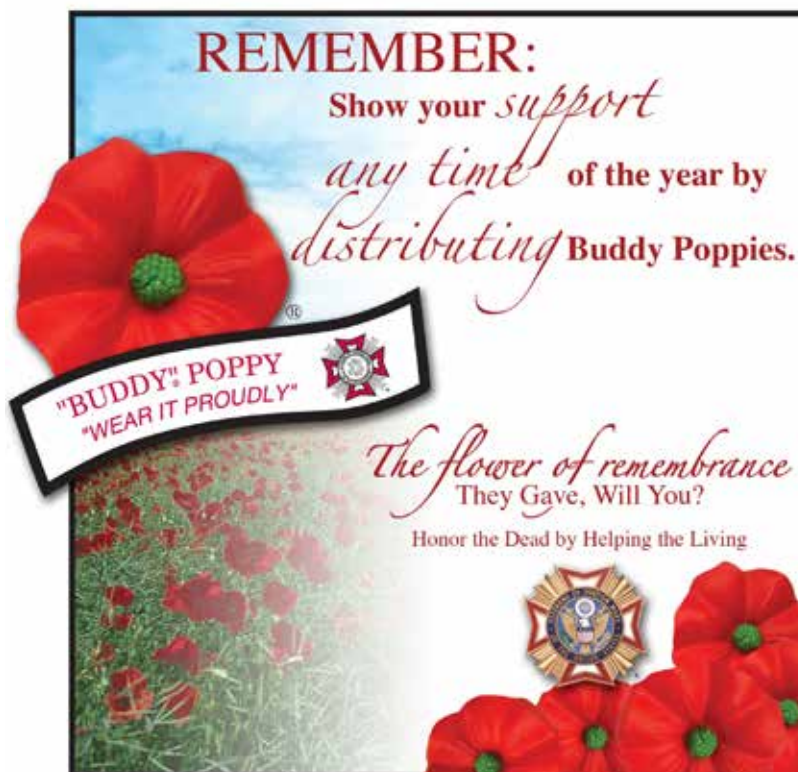

Gresham United Post 180 answers the call!

Gresham United VFW Post 180, Gresham Oregon

2 – 3 May 2019

On 2 May 2019, the Post Commander of Gresham United VFW Post 180 was notified an Honor Flight, hosted by Last Frontier Honor Flights, was returning from their visit to Washington, D.C. and would be stopping overnight in Portland, Oregon before returning to their homes in Alaska. Last Frontiers was looking for some simple

snack bags to give to the 54 veterans upon their arrival in Portland.

David Lowe, Post Commander called Jennifer from Last Frontier Honor Flights to find out what was needed. Jennifer asked for a piece of fruit, a bag of chips and a granola bar. Post 180 went into action.

"That's not a whole lot for someone who has been on a cramped airplane for five to six hours," Commander Lowe stated. "I went to the store Friday morning and bought supplies to make 63 snack bags." Each snack bag contained either an apple or an orange, a granola bar, single serving size bag of cookies, single serving size beef jerky or beef stick, a couple small pieces of candy, a bag of chips and a small bottle of water.

Along with Commander Lowe, Junior-Vice Commander Bill Dennis and Adjutant Robert Dooms spent a couple hours putting the bags together, followed by a quick trip to the hotel, to arrange for a couple tables.

The Honor Flight was scheduled to arrive at 2025, so Commander Lowe and Adjutant Dooms began setting up at 2000. More than an hour late, the veterans

began arriving about 2145. The group was made up of veterans from WW II, Korea, and Vietnam, along with the staff of assistants from Last Frontiers. Hungry and tired, the group found the snacks a welcome sight. "Jennifer and Randy from Last Frontiers were overwhelmed and delighted by the generosity of Post 180" Commander Lowe reported. "They just could not thank us enough."

"We look forward to doing this again in October when they come back through here with their next flight," said Junior-Vice Commander Dennis. "This is what we are here for, supporting veterans!"

If you recruited a new volunteer for a VA or non-VA facility, complete this form and have your Auxiliary Hospital Chairman sign it. Send one copy to National and one copy to me. National has awards that they will be giving out for recruiting. In addition, every member who recruits a family to volunteer (defined as at least one parent/guardian or grandparent and one child or grandchild); will receive an award from National. Even if you don't win an award from National, you may receive something special from me at Convention, so fill out those forms and get them in!

I know I have mentioned Operation Zero before, but I want to remind you of this organization that the VFW has partnered with because of the great tools they have for our veterans.

The foundation enhances social connectedness among Veterans and improves access to mental health and wellness resources.

Objective Zero Co-founder and Executive Director Betsey Mercado said her foundation was proud to partner with VA to improve the well-being and mental health of Veterans.

"Joining efforts with this community provides better access to resources and highly needed support for the men and women that have served and sacrificed so much for our country," Mercado said.

VA has a suite of mobile mental health apps that offer information about mental health issues, tools to help develop and practice coping skills, and assessments that allow users to track progress over time.
